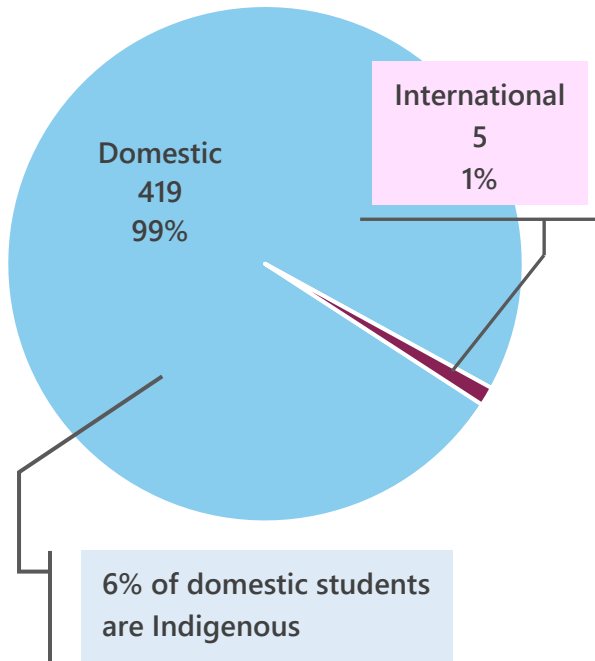


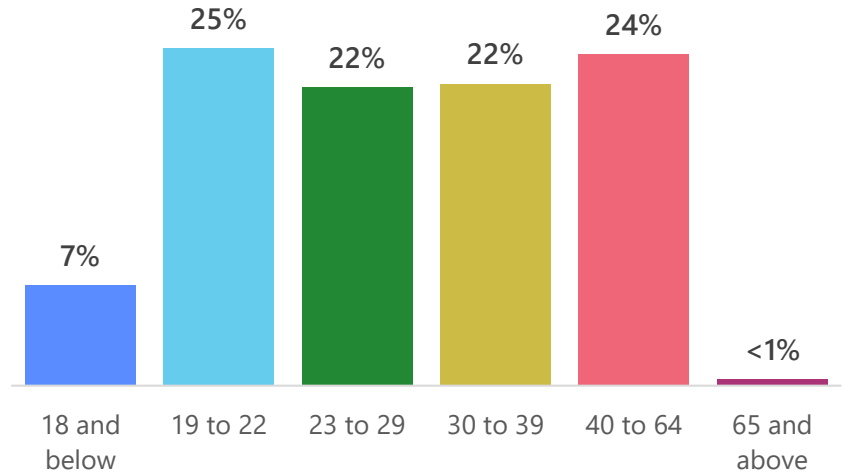

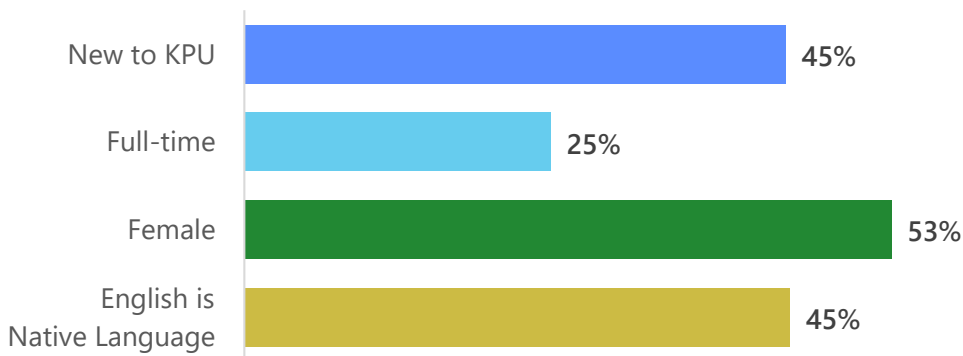
Headcount



Age Distribution of Students

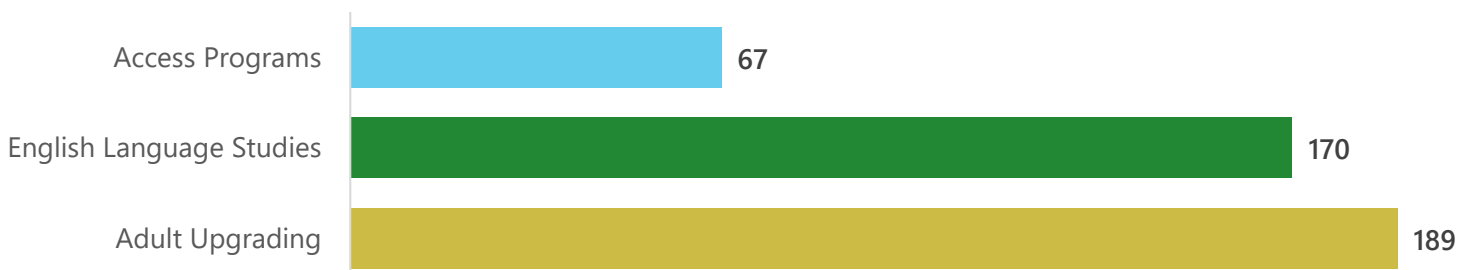


Key Student Demographics

Headcount total is greater than 424 due to some students changing their program during the academic year.



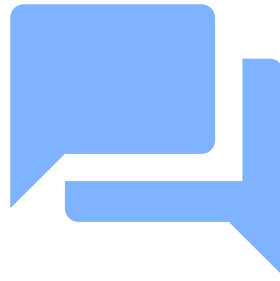
What KPU Academic & Career Preparation Students Tell Us

Of the 125 eligible ACP students registered in Fall 2020, 49 (39%) responded to the survey



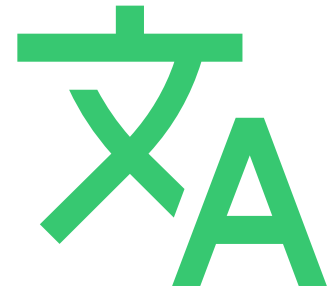
Born in Canada

Disability & Ongoing Medical Conditions



50% of students have a disability or ongoing condition that affects their functioning which they consider a disadvantage in their studies.

Mental health conditions such as depression and anxiety are prominent (23% of students), in addition to learning disabilities such as dyslexia (23% of students).

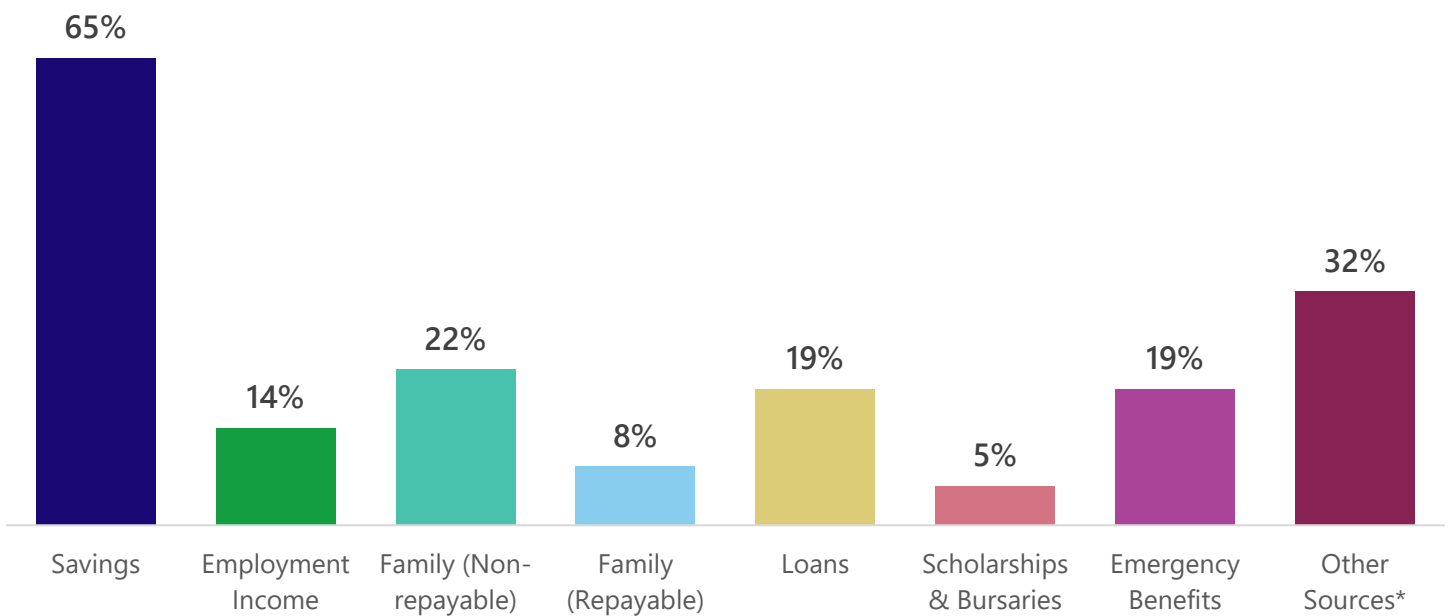
Weekly Hours Worked in Paid Employment

How Students Deal with Textbook Costs

30% of students in the Faculty of Academic & Career Preparation have tried to avoid textbook costs in some way, sometimes changing their educational plan to do so.

For example, 8% of ACP students report not purchasing an assigned textbook at some point in their studies.
