ABE and ESL now tuition free

BC Government abolishes tuition fees

- As of September 1, 2017 the BC government has eliminated tuition fees on Adult Basic Education (ABE) and English Language Learning (ELL) programs, opening the door for tens of thousands of people to upgrade their education and skills.
- Other students fees and costs will still exist.
- Adult Upgrading Grants (AUG) are available for eligible students through KPU's Student Awards & Financial Assistance Department.





KPU's ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT

Any of the following achievements can be used to satisfy this requirement:

High School Grades

A grade of "C+" in one of the following courses (or equivalent from another school system):

- English 12
- English Literature 12
- English 12 First Peoples
- IB English A1 or A2 (HL or SL)
- English 12 from a completed Adult Dogwood Diploma

NOTE: Communications 12 requires an "A"

ACP has several qualifying pathways to help your students move forward. They can benefit from:

- Program levels to suit all learning abilities— Fundamental up to Grade 12 courses, and university qualifying studies
- Flexible scheduling—day or evening classes with full and part-time study options
- Start dates throughout the year in some Continuous Intake (CI), individually paced courses and in Fixed Intake (FI) semester-based courses
- Small class sizes and extra tutoring support
- Upgrading in English, Math, Biology, Physics, and Chemistry Convenient program locations—Surrey, Langley, Richmond and Cloverdale campuses



KPU also offers upgrading courses in Physics and Biology through ACP, and in Chemistry through the undergrad Chemistry department:

- **✓ PHYQ 1098: Introduction to Physics**
- ✓ BIOQ 1098: Introduction to Biology
- ✓ BIOQ 1099: Introduction to Human Biology
- ✓ CHEQ 1094: Preparation for General Chemistry

These courses are all semester-based, since they include labs





How does a student get in? Here's the Application Process:

- 1. Book a free ACP English assessment and/or a free ACP Math assessment at a Student Enrolment Services counter, or show their high school transcripts.
- Apply in person for ACP Continuous Intake (CI) courses, or apply online for ACP Fixed Intake (FI) semester-based courses.
- 3. Receive test results if they did assessments in #1 & then it is recommended to book an appointment with our ACA Academic Advisor.
- 4. Register for courses and start their studies.




Testing Options
