


Student Level

Mental health conditions are most common: 26% of domestic students 7% of international students ...have a mental health condition, such as depression or anxiety.



Weekly Hours Worked in Paid Employment




* In 2019, 29% of domestic students and 14% of international students were not working.

Funding Sources for Education & Living Expenses






How KPU Science & Horticulture Graduates Do
