Courses and Programs	Students are allowed to select their courses from different degree programs.		
Grading System	Minimum passing grade: 70%		
	0- 69% (FAIL); 70-79% (ACCEPTABLE); 80-89% (GOOD); 90-100% (VERY GOOD)		
Enrollment procedure	Approximately two months before the beginning of the semester, the students receive a list with		
•	all the subjects, as well as the number of contact hours and ECTS credits. Enrollment takes place		
	one week before the beginning of the semester and the students can make changes to their		
	schedule up to two week after starting classes.		
Transcripts	All transcripts are sent directly to the home university, approximately two month after the		
	semester ends. Equivalence to ECTS is computed in transcripts.		



Other	
Visa Requirements	Most students do not need a visa to enter Uruguay. They receive a regular tourist allowance and can easily extend that allowance at the National Immigration Office after three months in the country. It's a simple, low cost procedure. Students should contact the local Uruguayan Consulate for specific information.
Accommodation	Universidad ORT Uruguay does not offer on-campus residency halls but provides the students with a list of off-campus housing options. International students are expected to select and to pay for their accommodation.
