

DONOR-FUNDED ENTRANCE AWARD CRITERIA



Chong-Yong & Chong-Hui Lee Memorial Award (Essay required)

In 1972, Mr. & Mrs. Lee emigrated from Korea with their five children. Despite the harsh financial realities the family faced, Mr. & Mrs. Lee instilled the value of education in their children and insisted that they all complete post-secondary education. Their support and encouragement were the source of inspiration for their children faced with the language and cultural barriers in their studies. Now as contributing members to Canadian society, their children would like to help those students faced with educational barriers, by having chosen unconventional educational paths.

Criteria: Student entering Kwantlen Polytechnic University for the first time; 18 years or younger; homeschooled in their senior secondary school years and have not received a Dogwood diploma, regardless of how long they have been homeschooled; applicant to submit a letter from the registering school, stating the years when he/she was registered as a homeschooler; highest English and Math Placement testing scores upon entrance; submit a short essay on the topic of homeschooling or post-secondary education (i.e. your experience of homeschooling, the educational goals, or any other discussion that indicates your desire for post-secondary education); enrolled full time or part time in any program at Kwantlen Polytechnic University; preference given to a full time student.

CORSA Youth Initiative Scholarship (Statement required)

The CORSA Youth Initiative Scholarship is awarded to a graduating student proceeding to a full-time program of studies at Kwantlen Polytechnic University. Candidate must demonstrate: South-Asian/Indo-Canadian Heritage; financial need; character, citizenship, initiative, academic achievement; extra-curricular involvement and leadership.

A completed budget worksheet must be submitted as supporting documentation in order to be considered for this award - see last page.

Supporting documentation must include:

- one letter from the school principal (or his/her designate) confirming character, scholastic achievement, initiative
- one letter from a teacher or counselor certifying leadership, initiative and character
- one-page personal statement on "Why I should be awarded this scholarship".
- one-page letter which provides an indication of intended post-secondary program of studies and a summary of school and/or community activities.

Dr. Bikkar Singh and Mrs. Surjit Kaur Lalli Endowed Scholarship

The Bubber Family has established an award in honour of Dr. Bikkar Singh and Mrs. Surjit Kaur Lalli. This award is available to a student entering Kwantlen for the first time and studying in any discipline.

Criteria: must be graduating from a Surrey inner city high school, financial need. Preference will be given to students demonstrating volunteer involvement and in good academic standing.

A completed budget worksheet must be submitted as supporting documentation in order to be considered for this award - see last page.

Dr. E. Jane Fee Award

Criteria: financial need; demonstrated community involvement; student graduating from the Surrey School District.

A completed budget worksheet must be submitted as supporting documentation in order to be considered for this award - see last page.

Two awards valued at \$2,000 each (payable over 2 years, \$1,000 per year)

For continuance of the award after the initial installment, the recipient must maintain a program CGPA of 3.00 or greater.

Frank G. Hutchins Memorial Award

The family of Frank Hutchins is pleased to present this award to a promising, diligent student, with an excellent work ethic (supporting documentation from the school is required).

Criteria: financial need; demonstrated community involvement or volunteerism. Preference given to a student graduating from Hope Secondary School.

Hardip Mann Entrance Awards

The Pacific Eagles Athletics Society and GN Sporting Club, in conjunction with the United Surrey Soccer League, is proud to sponsor an award in memory of Hardip Mann who was a leader, a visionary and always positive in promoting progressive reforms within sports. Above all, Hardip was humble, caring and a devoted family man. He was dedicated and focused around player development rather than winning medals or trophies. Janis Elaine Waller, mother of three young children and lifelong partner to her husband was a very vivacious and outgoing person who was always willing to help. Her care for others was demonstrated in her work as a high school Home Economics teacher. Janis' goal was to encourage and help promising students pursue higher education and ultimately a career in the fashion industry. In Janis' memory, her family and the Burnaby School District Home Economics Department is pleased to offer an award to a Burnaby high school graduate. The successful recipient will be selected by Burnaby School District Home Economics Department based on their interest in the desired fashion related programs offered by Kwantlen, along with their talent, aptitude and potential demonstrated by their work in their high school home economics classes.

The student will have achieved a minimum grade of A- in Home Economics related courses. The recipient will be announced in June at graduation. Funds will be made available once the student has registered in one of the following programs at KPU:

Bachelor of Design, Fashion & Technology
Diploma in Fashion Design and Technology
Diploma in Fashion Marketing

NOTE: first preference given to a Cariboo High School student, second to Burnaby High School and third to graduates of School District 41.

Available to students graduating from a Richmond Secondary school; enrolled in a business, accounting or marketing program at Kwantlen; financial need; letter of recommendation from high school teacher or counselor; interim high school transcripts.

A completed budget worksheet must be submitted as supporting documentation in order to be considered for this award - see last page.

Two awards valued at \$1700 each

KPU Marketing Management Entrance Scholarship

Available to students registering at Kwantlen for the first time who are enrolled in the Marketing Management Diploma program; based on academic achievement (interim high school transcripts must be submitted).

Two awards valued at \$3000 each

(paid over 2 years; \$1500 each year – subject to continuance requirements)

Kwantlen Student Association Entrance Award

Available to a student entering KPU for the first time who has previously been actively involved in community service (supporting documentation must be submitted). Preference will be given to a student enrolling full-time in the Faculty of Health. Faculty of Health at KPU includes Graduate Nurse Refresher, Nursing Degrees and Health Care Assistant program.

One award valued at \$1000

Laura Szendrei Endowed Memorial Scholarship Award

In loving memory of Laura Szendrei. A grade ten French Immersion Burnsvew student who was so bright and filled with promise. Talented in every aspect of school and in life with humility and understanding beyond her years. Laura was an individual who had a profound impact on the lives of each and every person who knew her. There were so many things in life left to do like graduate, get married and have children of her own. The loss of Laura's life as a victim of crime at the tender age of just fifteen, is every parent's worst nightmare. Laura was taken too soon from this world and will remain forever young. Criteria: well-rounded student involved in sports; demonstrated volunteerism or community service.

This award recognizes a student entering Kwantlen who has overcome adversity, demonstrated perseverance and who also possesses a noticeable positive outlook; volunteerism or community service (student will be required to submit reference letters confirming each activity); preference given to a graduate of School District 36.

Available to a student graduating from a Richmond Secondary school; academic achievement; (based on interim high school transcripts submitted)

Student Leadership Impact Award (Student statement/essay required)

This \$1000 award is granted to a student entering Kwantlen for the first time who has demonstrated an outstanding leadership contribution prior to entering Kwantlen, and who is also able to describe a compelling vision for their future impact on KPU campus life, as a student and as a citizen beyond graduation. Applicants will submit a letter outlining their leadership and volunteer contributions to date, with documentation and letter(s) of reference. They will also address in the letter, or a separate essay, the questions:

"How will KPU be a better place as a result of your student involvement and how do you imagine you will make your mark during University and beyond?"
