I can hardly believe it's November; the leaves are brightly coloured as they fall to the ground, the days are crisp or sometimes rainy. I love this time of year to cozy up and make plans or do projects, and the Commons has been busy.

I am really excited to share that plans are coming along for our office refresh. Our office will be closed December 16, 2023 to January 31, 2024. During this time, we will continue to work partially remote and partially on campus. We are making plans for members of our team to work at the other campuses. We are hoping this will serve as an opportunity to increase our visibility, and for you to connect with us wherever it's most convenient. Watch for signage and communication to know where to

find us. Most importantly, we will have a drop-in space for faculty when we reopen our space in February.

I also want to share that I had a wonderful opportunity to participate in a field trip with Dr. Dastur and a group of psychology students and the students who run the virtual reality lab. This experiential learning occurred at AeroSim in Richmond, where we got to fly a 737 simulator. Now you might be wondering, what is the point? Are we training pilots? Clearly not. And the purpose of this experience was different for each participant. Some were gaining an experience of how simulation is built, others were observing redundancy in design, and some were considering the cognitive factors.

The best part of this experience for me was talking to students who shared with me what they valued about this opportunity. They said it increased their motivation related to their career goals, it helped a kinaesthetic learner understand what she's been reading, and it made



the classroom discussions more relevant. These reinforced for me the value of experiential learning and the many shapes it can take. In its efforts to support research and innovation as well as promote high impact practices, the Teaching and Learning Commons has created an ePortfolio template that can be used across disciplines to guide students learning to do research. "Create Your Research Design" is a Pebble Pad based templated workbook to provide student researchers guidance to systematically develop a

research design of their undergraduate research project. This workbook includes nine guided steps that will prompt students to critically think about their research approach that will eventually help them with their research design. It also includes a component that will allow students to reflect on their thought process as they were developing the workbook.

We are seeking instructors interested in piloting this workbook in an upcoming semester. The guidance in the workbook can be edited to address disciplinary or instructor specific language or resources. 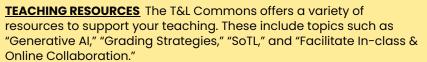
