Dr. Eldon Yellowhorn will report on the research study based on geophysical surveys that revealed 104 burials at the Brandon Indian Residential School in Manitoba. He will also discuss lessons applicable to future directions in similar investigations at other former residential schools. Dr. Yellowhorn established SFU's Department of First Nations Studies and has conducted impact assessments in advance of terrain altering activities. He contributes as an archaeologist to the Missing Children Project initiated by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission to search for children who died at residential schools.

Courses in Review

Surrey Traffic Management Centre • April 9th, 2024

On April 9th, a full complement of members who registered for: "*Tour of Surrey Traffic Management Centre*" TMC, at Surrey City Hall, showed up with great enthusiasm. The focus was specifically: Why is there congestion on Surrey streets?

Graeme provided an overview and context for Surrey. Over the last year, 6000 notifications indicate the





top three causes of congestion in Surrey are: Roadwork (55%); School and Seasonal Traffic Fluctuations (15%); and Traffic Collisions (10%). These represent about 80% of all causes of congestion.

Surrey's population today is ten times larger than it was 50 years ago; about 650,000 residents compared to 65,000 residents in the 1970's.

80% of trips in Surrey are taken by car.

The technologies and workflows employed by the Traffic Management Centre (TMC) are aimed at improving efficiency of the current road capacity and making travel safer for everyone.

TMC staff remotely monitor faults of the traffic signal sensors including the pedestrian push-buttons and the vehicle detector loops.

Graeme demonstrated ways that technology is used to improve the safety of road users. Surrey was one of the first cities in the country to use the thermal camera people crossing the road and automatically trigger amber flashing warning lights.

Graeme Cross P. Eng. with 24 years of public transportation engineering experience conducted a tour of his workplace. He is Surrey's Transportation Systems Manager.
