Call to Order

The Chair called the meeting to order at 6:10 pm and the presenters and guests.

Presentation

International Education

Derek Francis, Vice President Educational Services, spoke generally on internationalization activities and Kwantlen's international student program.

The University College has concentrated on the recruitment of international students as a first step leading to the establishment of international partnerships, contracts and faculty and student exchanges. Kwantlen currently serves approximately 250 international students or 170 FTE annually. Kwantlen actively recruits in Hong Kong (68), Taiwan (72), China (19), India (4), Indonesia (8), Malaysia (2), Singapore (2), South Korea (17), and Thailand (4). We also have international students from the US, India, Brazil, Kenya and fourteen other countries.

Markets are accessed through a variety of recruitment techniques including translated versions of Kwantlen's international education web side. In support of recruitment activities we have partnerships with Boren Sino Canadian School in Kumming, China and the Canadian International School in Singapore.

Board Regular Minutes 1 28 June 2000 Many international students have completed secondary school in BC or transfer to us from other post-secondary institutions. Local recruitment efforts are concentrated in Kwantlen's catchment area school districts.

International student "programs of interest" include

- Business Administration

Gordon Lee, Dean School of Business and Alice Wong, Coordinator International Education presented "linkage activities for 2000 and beyond" which included:

- "Field Test of Tool for Institutional Diagnostics" (completed September 1999).
 Kwantlen was partnered with Dalian Institute of Light Industry in China and Centennial College, Ontario
- "Women in Enterprise Management Project (completed March 2000). Kwantlen was partnered with Vancouver Community College and Wuxi University of Light Industry in China

New Projects include the "North American Mobility Project (started May 2000) and Kwantlen is partnered with Mt. Royal College, Alberta; West Virginia University, and Texas Christian University, USA; Universidad Autoaoma de Guadalajara and Universidad de Guanujuato, Mexico. This project involves the Interior Design department and will allow a number of students to study for one semester in one of the partner institutions.

Future plans include scholarships for both Kwantlen and international students.
