ACCC Symposium / 25-26 September 2001

The ACCC, in response to pressure from its membership at the ACCC Conference in Windsor, Ontario, is engaging more strongly in lobbying the federal government on behalf of the colleges of Canada. The President announced that he is hosting an Elders Feast for First Nations elders in our service area on 14 November at 5:00 pm. The purpose of this event is to honour the elders in our community and to put elders in contact with First Nations students at Kwantlen.

The Ministry is funding Kwantlen for 32 new nursing seats for January 2002 and building a new nursing lab on the Surrey campus.

Mr. Triplett shared some of the numerous accomplishments achieved by faculty, staff, administration and programs at Kwantlen.

AECBC Report

Navnit Shah reported that the Ministry of Advanced Education recently replaced the boards of Okanagan University College, Capilano College and Camosun College.

The AECBC Executive approved plans for dissolution of the AECBC. They will be presented for approval at the Special General Meeting to be held Monday, 01 October at 1:00 pm at the Marriott Hotel in Richmond. If passed, the AECBC would be legally dissolved as of 02 October 2001.

There will not be a Board Members education workshop in November. Camosun College will host a conference in May 2002.

Jacquie Rice, in conversation with Ann Frost, Chair of AECBC, was asked if Kwantlen would be willing to host a secretariat until the end of March. There was strong Board consensus that we decline this request.
