
# Taking the MPT @ KPU

- Student Registers for the MPT (at least 2 weeks before you need to take the test). This is practice time.
  - <u>https://www.kpu.ca/testing/math/mpt</u>
  - Surrey, Langley, Richmond, Civic
  - Remote (Virtual) for students living 100k+ from campus
  - Student gets an email confirmation/receipt with instructions.

This is only sent to your KPU student email. Read instructions carefully!

### Student Activates ALEKS PPL Account

- Information is sent to KPU Student email with the ALEKS PPL link.
- Login with KPU credentials (SSO)
- Welcome Screen click on KPU Placement



### Do Initial assessment to see where your skill set is currently.

#### Start working on the modules to improve your skills.

- You need to do 3 hours work in the module before you can take placement assessment #2.
- When you're ready, take placement assessment #2.
- This is an un-proctored assessment that just informs you where you would score on the real MPT.
- How did you do?

Even if you score high enough, keep working on the modules to improve your skills.

- You need to work in Module for 5 hours before you can take the 3<sup>rd</sup> placement assessment.
- When you're ready, take placement assessment #3.
- This is an un-proctored assessment that just informs you where you would score on the real MPT.
- How did you do?

This is all done at home and tests are <u>Un-proctored</u> Placement Assessments to get you ready for the MPT. The more work you do in the modules, the better you will score on the MPT at KPU.



#### Taking the MPT at KPU

The 4<sup>th</sup> and final Aleks placement assessment is the MPT. This is a Proctored test, taken at one of the KPU test centres.

This score will be recorded on your student record for Admissions and placement decisions.

Your score may be high enough to get into the course you want, but if not, you will be placed in a Math course that will better help you succeed. Talk to an Advisor about this placement.

Before you go to campus to take this final MPT, you need to activate your Moodle account. Follow the instructions on your booking receipt/email.

• Student activates Moodle account: at least 48-72 hours before scheduled MPT

- Once logged in, Moodle Account is activated that's all you need to do!

- No multiple choice, must type-in answer and use tools functions (on-screen calculator enabled for complex questions). You practiced this at home, so you are prepared.
- Student logs in: KPU Student Number & Password

- 'Math Placement Test' ALEKS PPL
- One of our Testing Administrators will guide you through the log in steps.


