



KPU Health Tech Connex (HTC) Application

KPU is a founding partner in a health technology incubator called Health Tech Connex (HTC). HTC's mandate is to quickly and effectively bring leading health technology solutions to market. Under the umbrella of HTC, KPU alumni will be given the opportunity to conduct research, launch a business, or commercialize their ideas in an exciting and innovative environment. Entrepreneurial KPU alumni with health-related business concepts, initiatives and ideas are invited to participate in this project.

Successful applicants will work collaboratively alongside other health technology innovators and be provided access to hospital and medical facilities, business development consultants, funding agencies, office space, and shared administrative support for a period of 18 months at no cost in the centre, located adjacent to Surrey Memorial Hospital.

Examples of types of projects that fit the profile are:

- Adaptive Clothing for people with health related issues
- A brain-computer interface for amputees robotic arms to a new training model for compound fractures
- A re-imagined wheelchair ramp, to a better way to monitor the vital statistics of mobile patients
- A data storage and analysis methodology that enables prediction of coma-patient recovery rates, to the creation of computer models that optimize hospital layout

About HTC

Health Tech Connex (HTC) is part of the City of Surrey's larger "Innovation Boulevard" program. Innovation Boulevard brings together more than 180 health-related organizations, KPU, UBC, SFU, the Jim Pattison Surgery and Outpatient Centre, the Fraser Health Authority and Surrey Memorial Hospital (SMH) in one square mile of Surrey's core across from SMH. HTC is a purpose-built hub where businesses, researchers, academics and the medical community work collaboratively on a variety of health-related solutions. As a partner in HTC, KPU is permitted shared office and research space in HTC, which the university has extended to alumni, faculty and students.

Criteria for applicants

Applicants must be KPU alumni; (anyone who was granted a degree, honorary degree, diploma, certificate or citation by KPU at any time.) Applicants must provide a description of the proposed project. Applications will be considered on the following criteria:

1. The project will increase the well-being of the people in the community.
2. The project will highlight the success of KPU alumni regionally, provincially, and globally.

Alumni selected for participation in the HTC program will help KPU meet the above-stated goals. In making this determination, the selection committee may consider: the project's probability of success, how the successful project would aid community members, the degree to which access to the HTC facility affects the project's likelihood of success, the applicant's history of success in previous endeavours, the relevance of the applicant's experience to the project, the ability of the applicant to contribute to other health technology related projects being conducted within the HTC facility.

In addition:

- Applicants must sign the application form, acknowledging their name, photo and credentials may be published in various media if selected for the placement.
- Although there will be no geographical limitations for candidates, no travel allowances will be provided for relocation.
- Current Alumni Board of Directors are not eligible to apply.
- The Alumni Office will protect the privacy and confidentiality of applicants and their ideas.
- All applications must be received by the KPU Alumni Relations Office by August 31, 2014
- Applicants must be able to move into the facility in September 2014 if selected.
