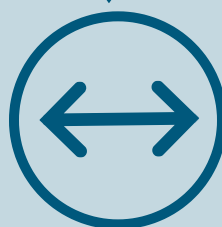

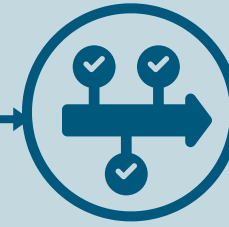

Why Curriculum Mapping

- Clarifies what is included and what is excluded from the curriculum
- Provides students with an understanding of what is expected and what they accomplish from different educational activities.
- Highlights the relationship between program and course outcomes and how they are achieved.
- Identifying gaps, redundancies, and misalignments in the curriculum
- Provides a venue to measure quality of curriculum.

What is Curriculum Mapping

Curriculum mapping is the process of identifying, defining, and documenting all that makes up a curriculum.

What is a Curriculum Map

A document detailing the alignment of written aspects of a curriculum. Also called a curriculum matrix document.

Faculty and students understand what is included.
