



## Design thinking

- Helps envision and model alternate futures
- Encourages intersectional, circular, and systems thinking within outcomes-based process
- Encourages multi-scale considerations




















## Community engagement

# Opportunities for Adaptive Frameworks

- Find planning processes that build community cohesion, trust, and shared ownership
- Plan for intersecting systems and cultures
- Grow comfort in ambiguity and changing landscapes
- Plan for lasting structures and networks
- Plan like an organizer



# Limitations of Adaptive Frameworks

- Can be slower to develop and complete
- May need to bring along funders, elected officials, and community in new approaches
- Requires regular planning effort to reflect, revise, and update plans
- Less valuable where there is relatively little ambiguity
