The content developer will be provided a time release for a single semester (Spring 2023) to complete the project deliverables.

## **Educational Content Developer on Trauma Informed Teaching**

Time Release: 12.5%

Period: January 2023 to April 2023

Project Deliverables:

The successful project recipient is required to develop a synchronous workshop (in-person or online) to be delivered on trauma informed teaching. Workshop materials to include a lesson plan, content, visuals, speakers notes, TL Commons branded and CC licensed. Asynchronous material has been created by previous team members and we are hoping to build on and integrate these already existing resources. The workshop should be offered in March 2023 and recorded for future viewing.

Qualifications:

- Subject matter expertise in trauma informed teaching & learning practices
- A general understanding of trauma as a condition
- Experience in developing educational resources
- Excellent oral and written communication skills

## **Educational Content Developer on Teaching through Research**

Time Release: 12.5%

Period: January 2023 to April 2023

Project Deliverables:

The successful project recipient is required to

- a) Develop an online asynchronous resource with educational content on approaches to teaching through research. The resource should include a description of what teaching through research is, distinguishing from other forms of strategic and value added teaching, an annotated bibliography of peer reviewed literature on the topic, the value proposition as to why faculty should engage teaching through research, best practice advice and case uses of teaching through research. The asynchronous resource is required to be developed using Moodle, Word Press or a KPU approved resource development tool.
- b) Develop a synchronous workshop (in-person or online) to be delivered on teaching through research. Workshop materials to include a lesson plan, content, visuals, speakers note, TL Commons branded, and CC licensed

The educational content developer must possess the following

- Be a subject matter expert in teaching through research
- Past teaching experience with research
- Experience in developing educational resources
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
