BACHELOR OF ARTS

Major in English

A Bachelor of Arts, Major in English nourishes your passion for literature and film. Our program offers a wide range of course options and provides plenty of opportunities for you to focus on your interests and expand your interactions with the literary world.

Requirements

A Bachelor of Arts, Major in English requires 120 credits in total, including:

- » Completing the BA Framework Requirements
- » Complete 51 credits in ENGL, including
 - » Complete ENGL 1100 and 3 ENGL credits at the 1200-level
 - » Complete ENGL 2250, as well as 6 other 2000-level ENGL credits
 - » Complete at least one course from each of three 3000-level groups:

BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS)

Major in English

Our program may appeal to students who are especially passionate about literature or who wish to pursue graduate studies.

Like the English Major, the Honours program evaluates narrative and its powerful interactions with our world. However, the Honours program offers a more immersive engagement.

Requirements

A Bachelor of Arts (Honours), Major in English requires 120 credits in total, including:

- » Completing the BA Framework Requirements
- » Complete 63 credits in ENGL, including:
 - » Complete ENGL 1100 and 3 ENGL credits at the 1200-level
 - » Complete ENGL 2250, as well as 6 other 2000-level ENGL credits
 - » Complete at least one course from each of three 3000-level groups:

- » Select 6 additional credits from courses in ENGL at the 4000-level, including those above, or ARTS 4800
- » Select at least 27 additional credits from courses in ENGL at the 3000- or 4000-level

Honours students may choose the Honours Thesis Project (ENGL 4990) as a 4000-level elective course. For this optional course, students propose, develop, and create a thesis project on an original research question while working closely with an English faculty supervisor who has expertise in the area.

BACHELOR OF ARTS

Minor in English

A valuable addition to any student's degree, a Minor in English appeals to a diverse range of employers and opens doors to further studies. From careers in education and law to journalism, creative writing, film, PR, and beyond, English students face a world of possibilities.

A Minor in English gives students the flexibility to choose courses that suit their interests.

Requirements

An English Minor requires 30 credits:

- » 6 first-year ENGL credits (ENGL 1100 and 3 ENGL credits at the 1200-level)
- » Any 9 ENGL credits at the 2000-level (ENGL 2250 recommended)
- $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{y}}$ Any 15 ENGL credits at the 3000-/4000-level
