 - Betty has agreed to be the Supervisor for the students
 - A student would need to be hired as soon as possible to start on the planning process
- **Steve** mentioned the Fair Trade Conference being held on the Surrey Campus the Tuesday after Sustainability Week and the possibility of a partnership between the two.

7. KEYS

- Steve discussed the non-profit organization KEYS Housing and Health Solutions.
 - The have a Community Garden on Barnston Island which provides food for their food banks.
 - Sustainable Agriculture has partnered with KEYS to teach sustainable farming to their clients.
