KSA Updates/ Proposals</p>	<p><u>Talloires Declaration Proposal (For Consideration)</u></p> <p>KSA would like the committee to recommend to KPU Executives that the University should sign onto the Declaration and develop an overarching sustainability policy which can be used to guide the institution on decisions and development from here forward.</p> <p>The Talloires Declaration has played a major role in raising international awareness about the significance of sustainability in higher education. Other Universities that have taken part are UBC, Royal Roads, UVic, SFU, Emily Carr and UNBC and more than 400 more institutions globally. If KPU takes part now we will be the 7th to do so. Making us in the top 10 Institutions in BC to take part.</p> <p>The Declaration has ten action areas which cover all the areas of university activity: teaching, research, operations, outreach and services. It was agreed that these actions align with KPU's Vision Statement.</p> <p>By signing the Declaration, KPU is saying it will agree to take the actions set out in the attached KSA Proposal</p> <p>There is no cost associated with signing the Declaration. You just submit your signed declaration with a Letter of Intent and the process will then move forward.</p> <p>Betty has suggested that Betty, Karen and Mairi meet with Dr. Davis to discuss.
