Education Assistant Program (EDAS)

- Prepares Education Assistants who will:
 - Work in both secondary & elementary school classrooms

Support students with a variety of learning and/or developmental differences





Education Assistants

- Work as team members with many different professionals
- Work in a variety of situations
- Support children with a variety of diverse learning needs
- What does that *look* like?

Learning: Skill Development and Academics

Positive Behaviour and Social Support



Personal Care Support

Flexibility Organization Individualized Support



Must be prepared to:

- Support students in English reading, writing, spelling, grammar
- Support students with their academic needs – this includes curriculum content from Kindergarten through Grade 12






Also, must be prepared to:

Assist students in personal care & medical support needs







The work of an EA:

- Increasingly complex
- Involves a high degree of educational decision – making, maturity, balancing multiple tasks and taking responsibility
- Requires people who can be flexible and think on their feet
- And ...





... extremely rewarding ...





Job Situation

- Over 8,240 people working as EAs in the Lower Mainland
 - approximately 17,900 in the province
- On call, fulltime and parttime positions
 - fulltime work approximately 28 30 hours
- New employees go on the on-call list first
 - usually working a lot
- Wages for EA positions
 - range from \$22- \$29 per hour



What is the Outlook for KPU EDAS Grads?

According to Student Outcomes research, 94% of grads are working in a related field, primarily as Education Assistants. (SORS, 2015) 98% identified EDAS as a quality program in terms of "usefulness."

17% went onto study in other fields (typically teaching or child/youth care worker)



Long-term needs

- Student enrolment in the overall number of children in schools is up and there is an *increasing number* of children requiring support by Education Assistants
- For example: 1/53 children are diagnosed with ASD (1/42 males; 1/189 females—CDC, 2018)
- Check the district(s) in which you want to work for their specific information

- EDAS graduates are required to have a high school diploma







English Options

- ENGL 1104
 - currently not transferable and cannot be used for B.A. undergraduate requirement
- ENGL 1100
 - transfers to other programs at KPU and other postsecondary institutions
- Note:
 - ENGL 1100 can be taken instead of ENGL 1104
 - can be taken before or during the program (max. of 10 years before graduation)



Part-Time Program

- Classes are <u>fully online</u>
- Practicum is face-to-face in K-12 schools
- Reliable Internet access is a must
- Basic computer skills are a must you don't have to be an expert, but you need to be able to word process, access the internet, and manage your files.





Part-time Program (Fully Online 2022)

Two years of study

- Yr 1: September through April
- Yr 2: September through May
- Tuesday & Thursday evenings
 - 7:00-9:50 PM
- Saturdays
 - 9:00 AM 2:50 PM (approximately 3 Saturdays/month)
- Practicum
 - Two, four-week placements (full-time in schools)
 - Yr 1: April
 - Yr 2: May





Full-time Program (On Langley Campus)

Nine months of full-time study

- September to May
- Mondays through Fridays
- 9:00 AM 3:20 PM
- Face-to-Face, <u>on campus (Langley)</u>



Practicum

- Two, four-week placements (full-time in schools)
 - January/February
 - May



Practicum

- Students <u>must</u> commit to four weeks
- Placement arranged between university and school districts students do not arrange
- If student already working, not guaranteed practicum in work setting



Now for the Admission Process







Admission Requirements

- English 12 grade of C+ or equivalent, Communications 12 grade of A
- **100 hours** of volunteer or work experience with children, preferably with children with special needs
- **Two letters** from different people supporting your successful volunteer or paid work experience
 - When submitting your letters, please keep your originals, and give KPU copies
- **Criminal Record Check** issued by the BC Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General (to be requested once an offer of admission has been made)

What Should the Letter Say?

- Who the person is in relation to you
 - teacher, supervisor, boss
- What you did
 - activities, teaching, support
- How long you worked there
 - length of time and hours



Reference letters

*Should be as official as possible....

- Letterhead is preferable
- Typed Letters with Signatures (no emails unless there is an 'official', corporate-like signature)

- Application: \$40.00
- Total Cost
 - Approximately \$7,200.00 FT and \$7,400 PT
- Textbooks
 - Approximately \$400.00 per semester
- Confirmation Deposit
 - \$500.00 (applied towards tuition)
- Additional cost to complete Criminal Record Check
 - \$60 (approximately)
 - students must use the form provided by Admissions.

When applying online

- Select:
 - Fall 2022 Semester
 - Undergraduate Category
 - Faculty of Arts
 - » Education Assistant Program

Note: Students who wish to apply to both full-time <u>AND</u> part-time programs will need to submit two separate applications (\$40 each)



Have you done post-secondary coursework which you think may transfer?

- If you have completed post-secondary course work from a public college or university (<u>after grade 12</u>), please provide the name of the college or university, and order transcripts.
- Also, answer "yes," to the question: 'Transfer assessment requested.' This will automatically trigger an assessment of all your post-secondary courses. If you don't do this then your option is to submit a transfer credit form available at Admissions.
- For example, do you already have:
 - First year English?
 - Written or Interpersonal Communications?
 - Child Development course?
- If "yes," you may qualify for transfer credit.



Next Steps - Admission Process

- Log into Online Self-Service (kpu.ca/oss) to view your personalized checklist of documents/requirements needed
- Successful applicants are sent admission offers based on date of qualification (when all requirements are met)
- Admission offers may be sent out as early as late January/early February

- Keep the originals of your reference letters for your own file (they cannot be returned)
- Drop copies off at Student Enrolment Services on any of these 3 campuses – Langley, Surrey, Richmond, or mail them to "Admissions, re: EDAS Program", KPU, 12666 72nd Ave., Surrey, B.C., V3W 2M8
- Official secondary and post-secondary transcripts for all institutions attended must be submitted to KPU Admissions no later than March 1.

- High school graduates who have not completed the STS form while in high school, can order an official transcript through the BC Student Transcripts Service
