- 1. Rajiv Jhangiani and Joel Murray Draft framework for Faculty development at KPU and Draft Policy AC 15: Micro-Credentials.
  - a) Teaching and Learning Plan for Faculty Development
    - New Faculty Development plan will be launched in August, after feedback has been received and revisions have been made in response
    - Intended to align with Academic Plan 2023
    - Focus on stackable competencies (basic training laddered into leadership training)
      - Learning Design
      - Learning Assessment
      - Inclusive Teaching
      - Learning Technology
      - Reflective Practice
    - Possibility of badged system, but not tied to performance review
    - Faculty development attended over the past year will be recorded as completed
    - All Teaching and Learning Commons trainings are open to all Instructional staff

## b) Draft Policy AC 15: Micro-credentials

- Now on Policy Blog Faculty and instructional staff invited to comment on blog or by email
- Goal is to introduce short, flexible, competency based offerings (credit or non-credit)
- Micro-credentials would require Senate approval
  - New subcommittee of Senate Standing Committee on Curriculum (SSCC) called Senate Micro-credential Committee (SMC) would provide initial feedback for all micro-credentials
    - Pathway for credit courses: SMC -> SSCC -> Senate
    - Pathway for non-credit courses: SMC -> Provost -> Senate
- Responses to questions / comments from Faculty Council:
  - No obligation to develop micro-credentials: Agency lies with department and/or faculty
  - Policies regarding graduation requirements and course delivery systems would apply to credit-bearing micro-credentials
  - KPU policy will align with soon-to-be-released Ministry Draft Policy on Micro-credentials

## 2. Approval of the Agenda of March 16, 2021

It was **moved** (Mike Coombes), **seconded** (Suzanne Pearce), **and carried THAT** the agenda be approved.

# 3. Approval of the Faculty Council Minutes of February 16, 2021

It was **move**d (Mike Coombes), **seconded** (Jane Hobson), **and carried THAT** the minutes be approved as amended.

#### 4. Business Arising

- Provost Sandy Vanderburgh responded to Faculty Council concerns about delayed add/drop deadline by sharing data regarding Fall 2020 GPAs for students who registered before, during, or after the first week of the semester
  - Slight reduction in GPA associated with later registration
  - Council noted that fall term had fewer lab courses, so may not be a good indicator of negative correlation between student success and late registration
  - Provost noted that effects of late registration may be masked by pandemic effects
  - Provost will ask OPA for additional data as it becomes available:
    - Spring 2021
    - Department-level analysis (in response to departmental concerns regarding lab completion and student success)
    - Registrar will also provide a report to faculty after week 1
      - Faculty will still need to compare names on class lists as neither IT or Teaching and Learning can provide reports on specific registration changes in first week
- Chair noted that after last months' guest presentation by the Anti-Racism Task Force, no one has expressed interest in establishing an FSH committee. Faculty are encouraged to contact the chair if they are interested.
- Chair noted that the motion regarding online proctoring and anti-plagiarism software has been forwarded to Senate and upper administration, as well as being brought to the attention of the FC Chairs meeting. No response yet.

## 5. Reports

#### a. Chair's Report

- Chair welcomed new student representatives, Chelsea Allison from Sustainable Agriculture and Monique Ly from Biology
- Chair noted that the FC Chairs meetings will now be monthly
- Chair acknowledged the announcement by the Dean of her retirement as of November 1, 2021

# b. Dean's Report

- The current course planning is for as much F2F for the fall term as possible (likely 70-100% F2F). More practical to room everything and pull back rather than the reverse.
  - o Draft schedule due by April 6th
  - Open again in May for modification regarding delivery options such as blended or online offerings
- Math program review site visit went well
- Horticulture quality assessment plan will be vetted by the Senate Standing Committee on Program Review at end of March
- The virtual academic integrity workshop was successful, providing good discussion and feedback
- SEPC (Strategic Enrolment and Planning Committee) is looking at retention, domestic recruitment and student services post pandemic

- President's Response to Research and Scholarship indicated which committees will consider
  White Paper Recommendations
- SSCUB voted to recommend Senate endorse budget
- Senate voted in favour of a motion to recommend faculty provide digital access to students wherever possible (Recommendation, not directive)
- Senate voted to recommend the official KPU 2050 Campus Plan to the Board of Governors for approval
- SSCAP Senate voted in favour of suspension of ACP Adult Special Education programming for 1 year to facilitate revision
- Senate approved new graduates
