b. Dean's Report

- Regarding the Tik Tokkers and in reference to Brett's email detailing the issue, Dean stressed that the correct course of action is not to engage at all and make sure no one in class engages. Just call Security to have them escorted off the premises.
- Dean expressed appreciation to Faculty Council for stepping up and voting on the slate for the Associate Dean Search Advisory Committee and referred council to the email re this
- Dean noted that EPT is promoting KPU EPT T shirts and asked that Council members spread the word to contact Melissa Drury.
- Dean noted that the recent AntiRacism Symposium was powerful and noted that the report made recommendations for prioritizing this university wide goal. Please view the report on the Anti-racism website https://wordpress.kpu.ca/antiracism/

c. Senate Reports

- The Provost's report and the report from the Standing Committee on Policy listed policies that are currently undergoing revision, including ST13 Course Withdrawal, which is available for comment on the KPU Policy blog until March 23rd. This is the final consultation phase for ST13.
- Revisions to seven MATH course outlines were approved.
- Revisions to the BSc in Biology and the BSc (Honours) in Biology were approved.
- Senate approved the list of members of the search advisory committee for the new FSH Associate Dean position.
- Senate voted in favour of a motion that will empower the Indigenous Admission
 Committee to determine appropriate ways to assess the English language proficiency of Indigenous applicants to KPU.

- SSC Program Review Fergal Callaghan
 - o The Mathematics first annual follow-up report was approved.
- SSCUB Fergal Callaghan
 - o No report
- SSCAP Allyson Rozell
 - o Revisions to Indigenous Admissions was passed, went on to Senate and was passed there also.

SSCC – Brett Favaro

- Note that FSH still has an empty seat on this important committee.
- Changes to the Biology Honours degree including removing the B in English 12 prerequisite for Biology 1110 (and 1210, late, but was included at Senate) were approved and also at full Senate.
- Dean noted that departments must ensure that someone is present to speak to any course outline changes in this committee.
- SSC Research and Graduate Studies Brett Favaro
 - The committee is working with Biology on research. Some background is coming from Melissa Cuthill (Library) on data management.
 - The committee is still wrestling with the mandate. Dean noted that his analysis of other institutions will be tabled at the next meeting.
- SSC Teaching and Learning Catherine Chow
 - Funding for a hybrid classroom has been provided.
 - o New technology is rolling out, called 'Padlet, launching on May 3 2023.
 - o The committee is looking at CHAT GPT risks institutionally.
 - FSH has the highest DFW rates at KPU. Might be a good idea to revisit which courses get the Pathways designation. A DFW working group will be established.
- SSC Policy Amy Jeon
 - Please respond to all policy blogs in phase 1 as this greatly helps the writers with more ideas to draft the policy with.
 - Policy AR2 regarding Indigenous students will determine how the admission committee makes decisions so that it is inclusive of English language proficiency and considers prior learning and so forth.

d. Committee Reports

- Nominations and Governance Michael Coombes
 - Michael thanked all who participated in the recent vote for appointments to the AD2 SAC and noted that the vote should have had an abstain option which will be made use of in future email votes.

- Curriculum Committee Brett Favaro
 - o Approved the discontinuance of several citations in horticulture.
 - o Interdisciplinary brewing history course approved.
 - o Approved eliminating the B requirement in Eng 12 for Biology 1110 and 1210.
- Academic Planning and Priorities Allyson Rozell
 - o Also approved the discontinuance of the Horticulture citations.

5. New Business - Brett Favaro

Background was provided on the rationale for discontinuance of 8 Horticulture citations
in order to facilitate the progress of the program review. Completion rates, enrolment
and overlap were key factors in the development of the motions. Three remaining
citations will be included in the program review. As program discontinuance also
involves calendar changes, Policy AC10 and D7 also need to be addressed. The goal is
that they will all be off the books for September 2023.

Turfgrass Pest Management
