1. Approval of the Agenda of June 17, 2025

2. Approval of the Faculty Council Minutes of May 20, 2025

3. Business Arising:

4. Chair's Report:

5. Dean's Report:

- Dr. Bruce Choy is the new president and vice-chancellor, effective September 2, 2025.
- Christina Heinrick will take on the Associate Dean *pro tem* position starting on July 1st. The search process will begin in the Fall. Please watch out for an announcement to serve on the search committee.
- Senate approved the suspension of the EPT program effective Fall 2026.

6. Senate Reports:

- From the May 26th meeting, Senate voted in favour of suspending the Diploma of Technology in Environmental Protection effective September 1, 2026. There were 15 votes in favour, 5 opposed, and 1 abstention.
- Senate approved the revised academic schedule for 2025-26. The first day of classes for Spring 2026 is pushed back by one day to January 7th. The campus will not reopen until January 5th. All other important dates will also be pushed back by one day.
- Senate also approved an omnibus approach to policy revision to support graduate studies at KPU.
- Senate approved allowing the results of various tests to count as satisfying the
 requirements for English undergraduate proficiency, as well as, placement into English
 language studies courses and placement into the pathway to undergraduate studies. Some
 of these will run as pilots for one or three years and will be reviewed after that.

- Joint meeting with SSCAPP.
- Carole Laplante, interim director of financial services, presented the principles and
 priorities that will guide the development of the 2026-27 budget. Both committees voted
 in favour of recommending that Senate endorse the principles and priorities with some
 amendment to the wording of the document that came out of the discussion.



• The timeline for the budget development was also presented. For the 2025-26 budget, the budget did not go to the Board until the end of March 2025. For next year, the draft budget will be presented to the Board in January 2026.

6.3. Senate Standing Committee on Academic Planning and Priorities (SSCAPP):

SSCAPP recommended that the Senate approve Institutional Recognition Request for DUNIS
Africa effective July 1, 2025. This sets up the relationship to start examining courses to
allow for transfer credit.

8. New Business:

• The Urban Ecosystems program suspension ends in August 2025. There was an early proposal that was brought to the School of Horticulture last year that would have involved really substantive changes. This includes a new acronym, possibly a new department, and it was complicated. One of the issues with this degree is the laddering from the diploma into a degree. The department is working on streamlining the laddering into a revised degree. For example, make use of courses in other programs like the Ecology courses in Biology.

9. Guest: Climate Strategy – Brett Favaro

Diane Purvey, Provost, appointed Brett Favaro to a secondment starting September 2024.
 Brett went around the university and other universities to figure out what others are doing.
 The <u>climate strategy draft</u> has two things, strategic priorities that would establish a credible and ambitious position for KPU in the area of climate sustainability and the values that will inform how to get there.
