5. Dean's Report:

- AGC has received \$1million from Genome BC
- Student Paul Virtue has won a silver medal at the BC Beer Awards, competing against professional breweries for his Belgian Dubbel.
 - At the same event, a robust policy conversation with a Senior person from Liquor Distribution Canada resulted in discovering that there is more we can do with student beer sampling. Further discussion is planned.
- Hort and Sust Ag bursaries are now available. There are 16-\$2000 bursaries. Students need to apply in January for Fall disbursements. https://finaidssb-

- Dean noted that he has started an award, contributing monthly through the Family Giving process to a student studying to advance Climate Change Study or Conservation
- Faculty Town hall was well attended, and the discussion questions were thought provoking and will be looked into.
 - For the foreseeable future the Dean will be focusing on:
 - Recruitment on both active and systemic fronts
 - Retention
 - Progression
 - Partnerships
- Rapid PLAR wherein a prospective student submits a portfolio of a combination of
 education and work experience and receives credit for lower-level coursework so that they
 can enter 3rd and 4th year courses and fill those levels more.
 - Nadine Siriban will be coming to the All-Chairs meeting in early December to present on this.
- Dean encourages discussion and will be working on program by program, pre-reqs/co-reqs checking for 'traps' affecting retention. Are there items with less of an argument for now. The goal is to remove barriers to retention.

6. Senate Reports - Allyson Rozell:

Senate held its first meeting of the 25/26 academic year at the Surrey Conference Centre, welcoming Senators and members of all Senate Standing Committees. The meeting opened with a land acknowledgement and a powerful welcome from Elder Lekeyten and his wife Cheryl, who among many things, told us to "be proud of KPU, be proud because you are carrying forward what the vision that our leader and the people who were sitting around that table had".

Dr. Choy provided an update that included who he has been meeting with and a general sketch of the external forces affecting KPU. He also discussed why Senate matters, and the purpose of bicameral governance and the essential role of Senate in upholding academic integrity. Senate, he said, is the "beating heart" of the university where diverse voices come together to uphold the values, standards, and responsibilities that define KPU as a university.

Senate approved the following:

- Academic schedules through to 2028/2029
- Search advisory Committees for three Associate Dean positions
- The list of graduates as of September 29, 2025
