Tuition Fee	Intensive Korean (200 hours): The Intensive Korean Program is a non-credit, certificate-only course offered by the Center for Korean Language and Culture. The program aims to help learners build the basic foundations to high level skills in the Korean language through a strict curriculum that focuses more on the technical components and accuracy of the Korean language. It is divided into different levels and runs on a fixed schedule from Monday to Friday. Classes are held for 4 hours within a 10 week time frame. Students are required to attend 40 days of the whole program, as well as pass the final language exam.  Conditions.

It is an introductory level Korean language program that aims to help students build a strong foundation in learning the complexity of the Korean language whilst building familiarity with common language and topics.
