- 1. <u>The Bill Reid Gallery of Northwest Coast Art</u>. Located at 639 Hornby Street Vancouver, and named after Haida artist Bill Reid (1920 1998). Free admission every Friday!
- 2. The Museum of Anthroplogy located at UBC. They are in the process of renewing their Great Hall.
- 3. <u>Little Italy</u> in Vancouver Located on Commercial Drive and 1st Avenue.
- 4. Japanese monuments in Stanley Park. Find the <u>Japanese Canadian War Memorial</u> (100 this year), a dragon figurehead of the Empress of Japan, and a Canada to Japan ocean liner from 1891 1922.
- 5. <u>Chinatown</u> in Vancouver. The third most populous in North America, and National Historic Site.
- 6. The Golden Village in Richmond. Dynamic hub of Asian culture for dining, shopping, and more.
- 7. The Punjabi Market along Main Street. 2020 marks the 50th anniversary.
- 8. Hollyburn Lodge at Cypress Mountain's Nordic area to learn the history of Swedish adventurers.
- 9. Heritage Christmas event at Burnaby Village. The outdoor museum is open Nov 21 Jan 1, 2021.
- 10. The Blarney Stone, Vancouver's oldest Irish pub, and Australia's Moose's Down Under in Vancouver.
