









>>> Age Distribution of Students








>>> Distribution of Students by Faculty

>>> Students Attending Multiple Campuses


> By Semester




> By Student Status in Academic Year



>> Student Enrolment Patterns




>>> Number of Graduates by Credential Type




Over 5,000 KPU students participated in the annual Student Satisfaction Survey in fall 2023.

Funding Sources for Education & Living Expenses




How KPU Graduates Do
