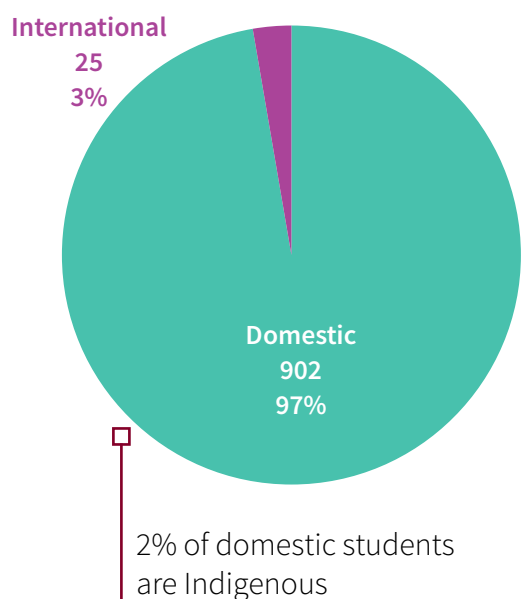


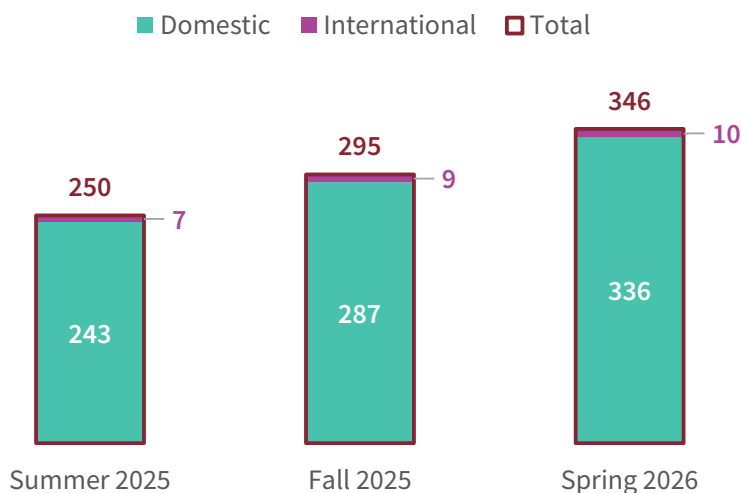

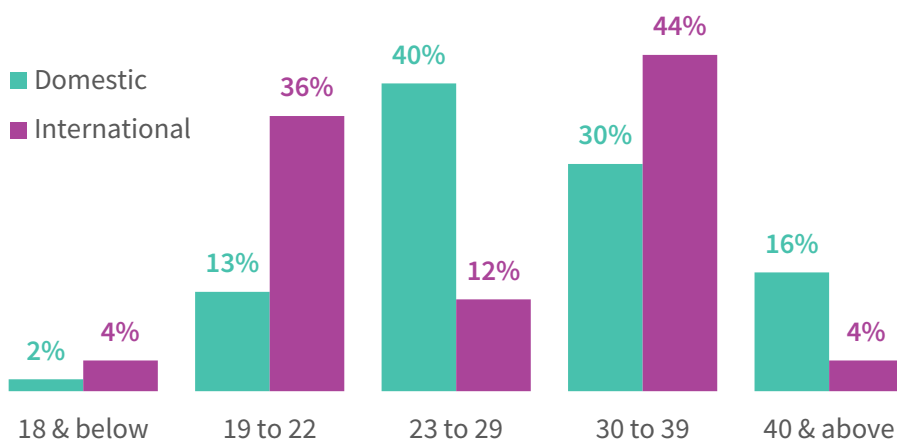

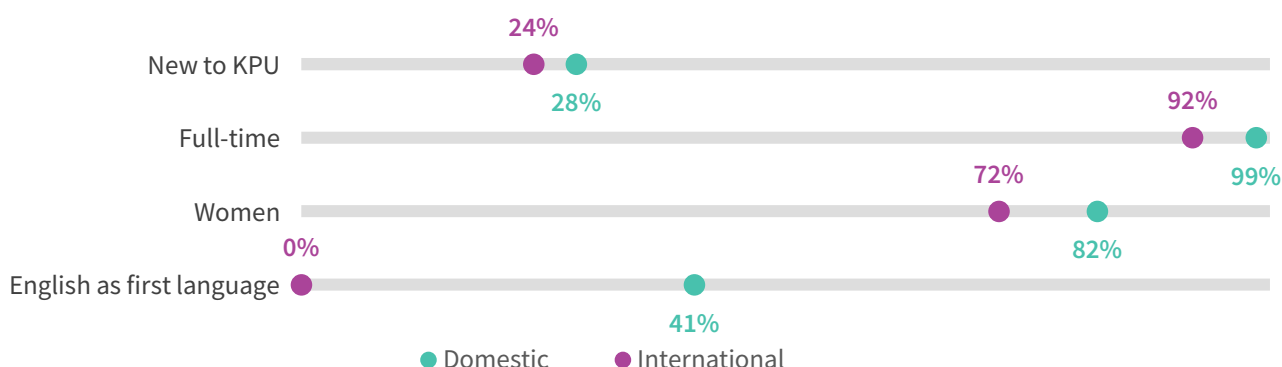
» Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)

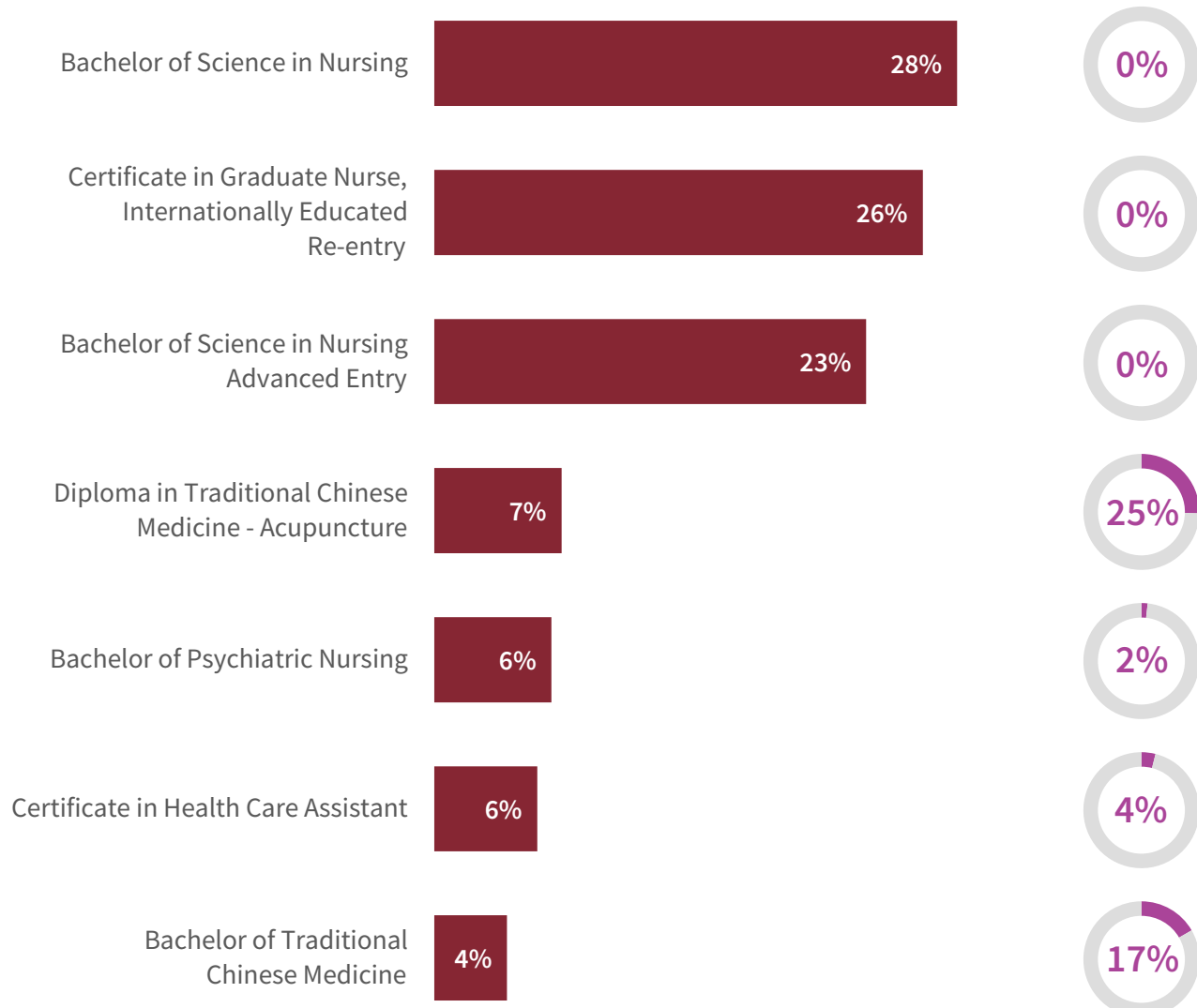

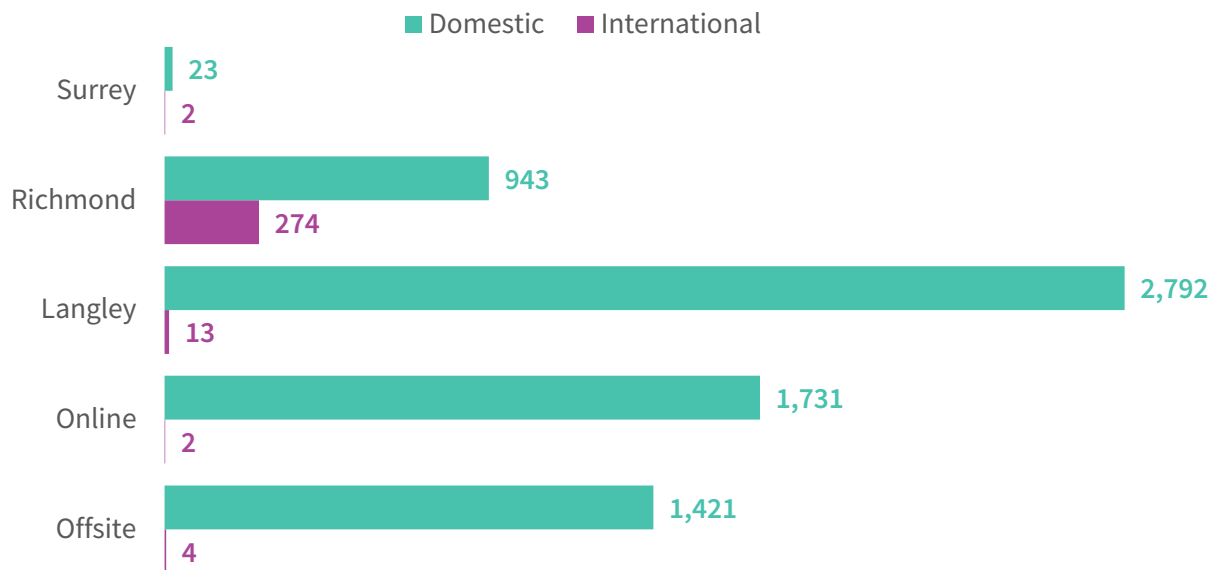
» Distribution of Students by Program

Proportion of international students in program



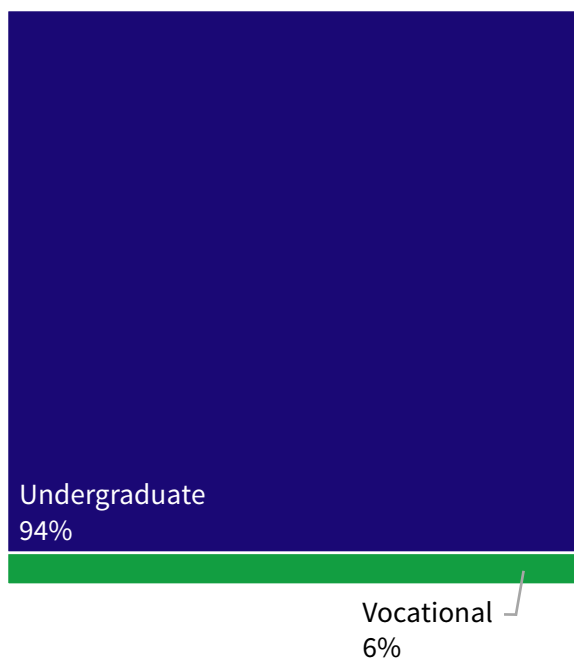
» Class Campus

Number of seats filled at each location. Students can take classes on more than one campus.

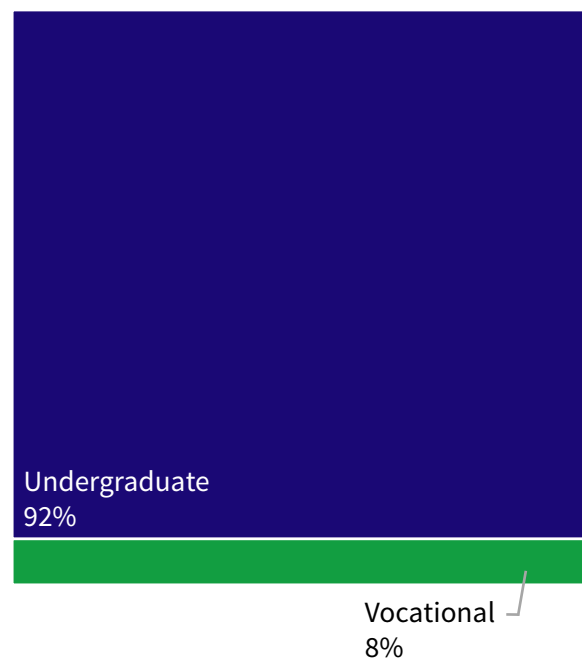

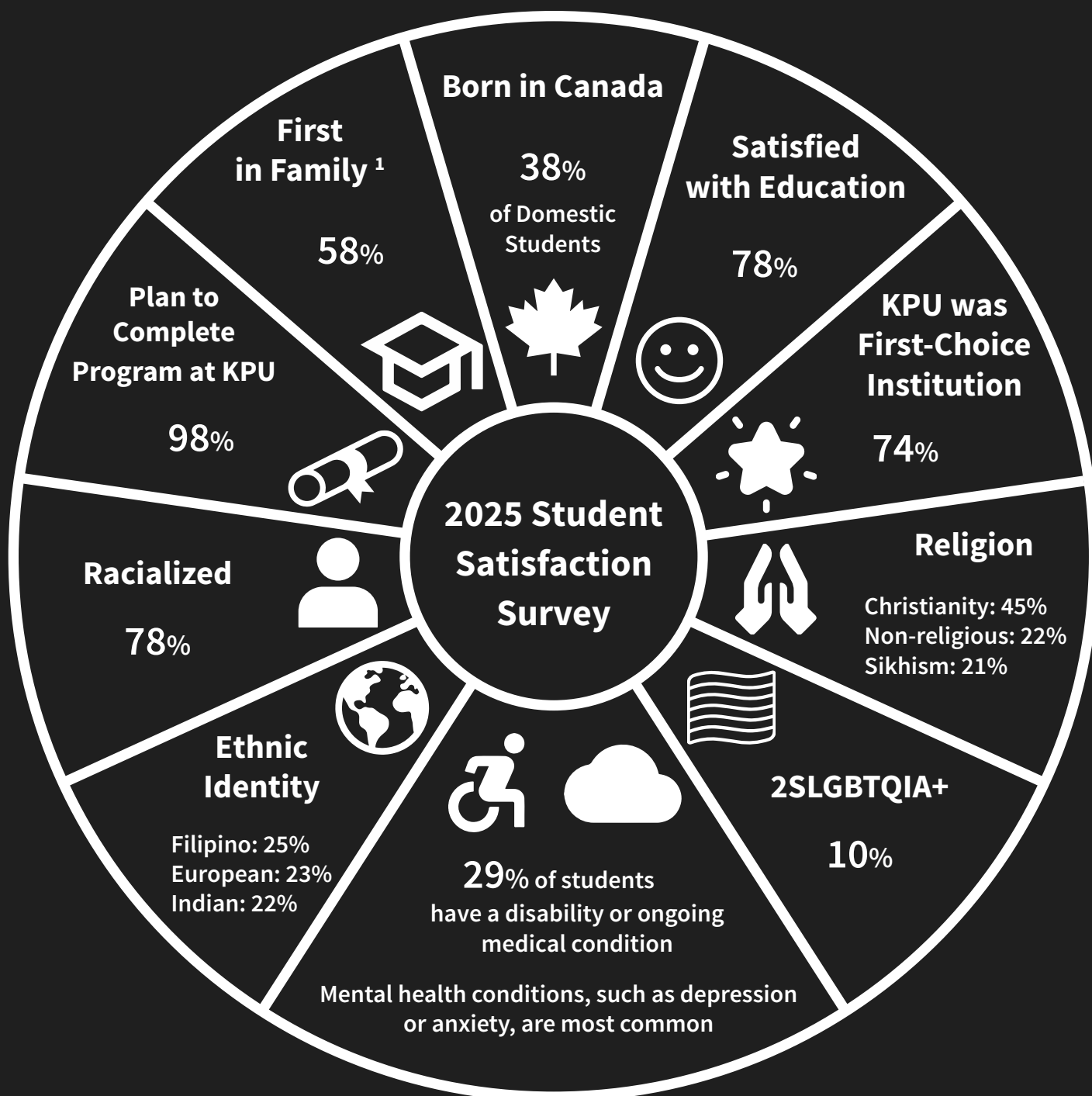
» Number of Graduates by Credential Type



What Health Students Tell Us

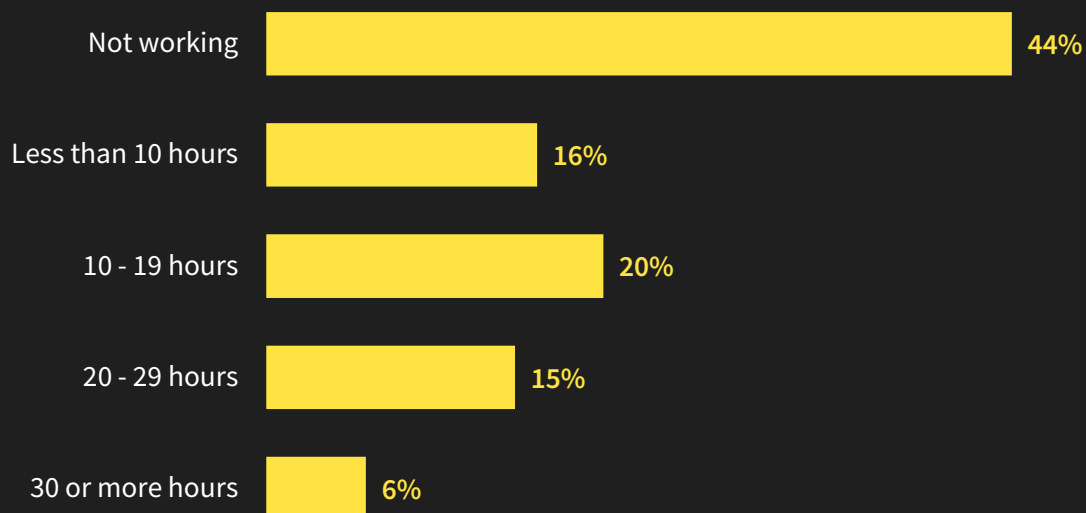
Of 636 eligible Health students, 332 (52%) participated in the annual Student Satisfaction Survey in fall 2025.

Excluding responses from students who preferred not to answer or did not understand the questions. Unless specified, data is not broken down by domestic/international status due to low number of international student responses.

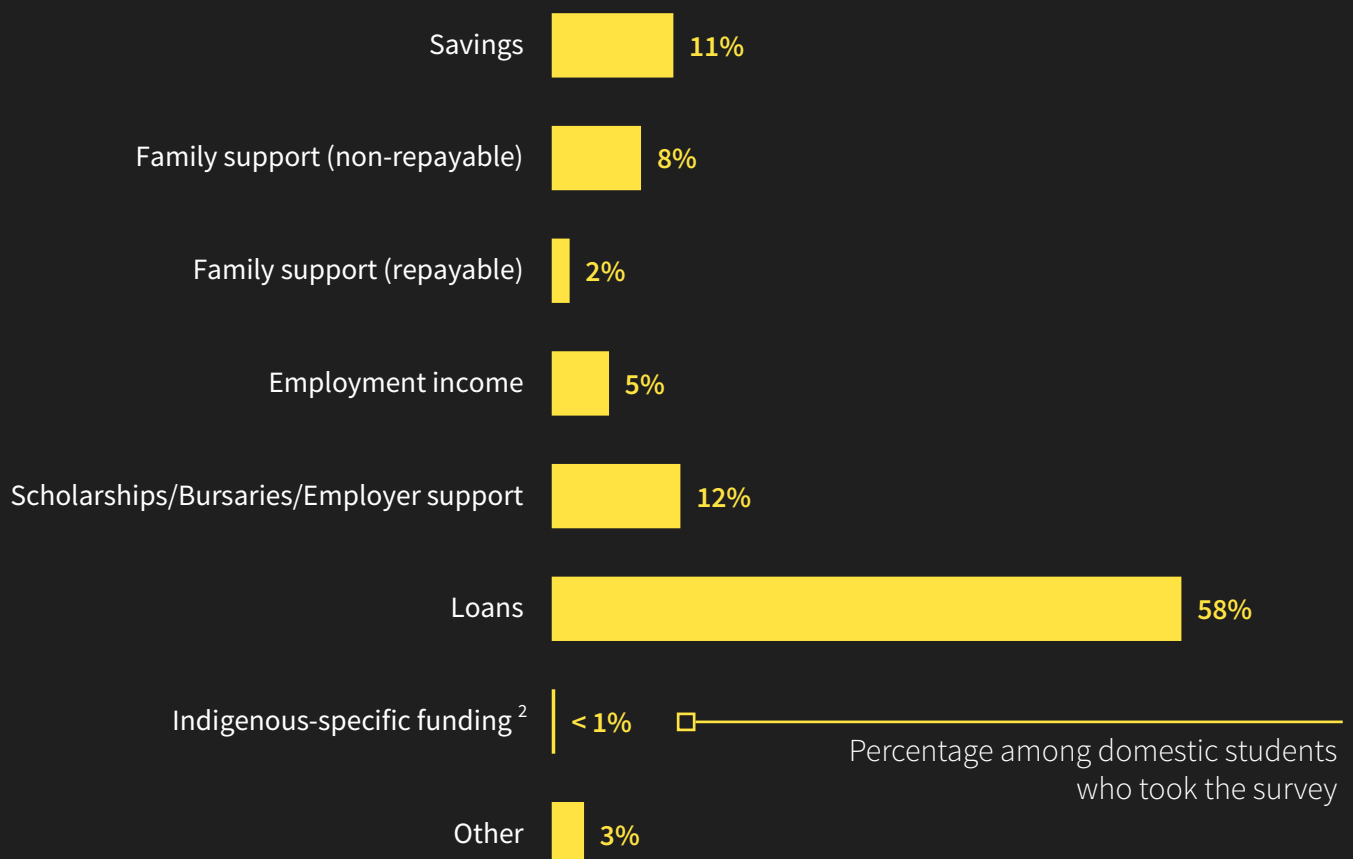

» Top Funding Source for Education & Living Expenses

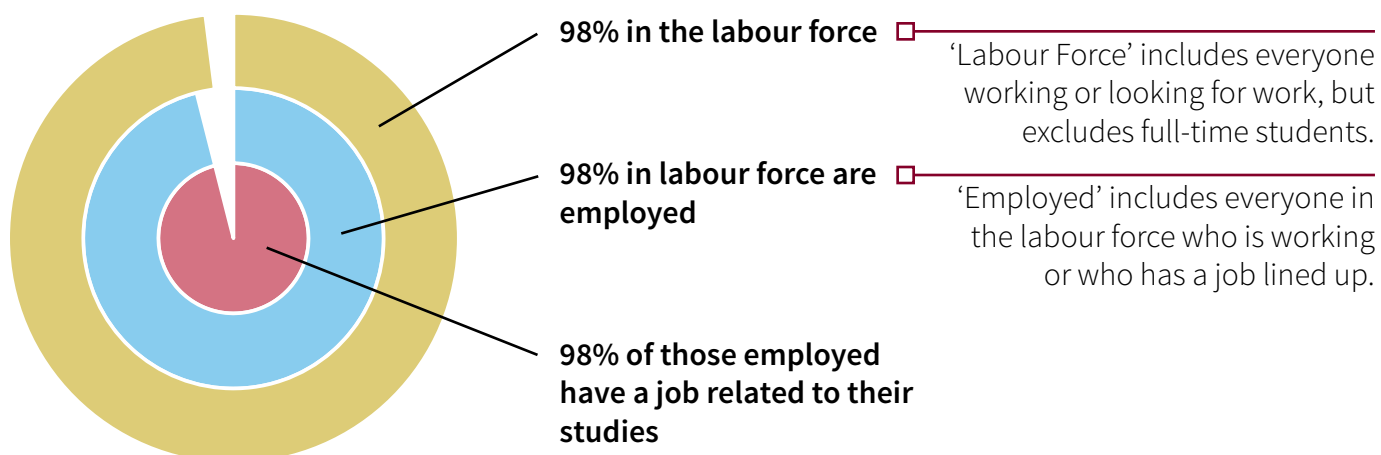

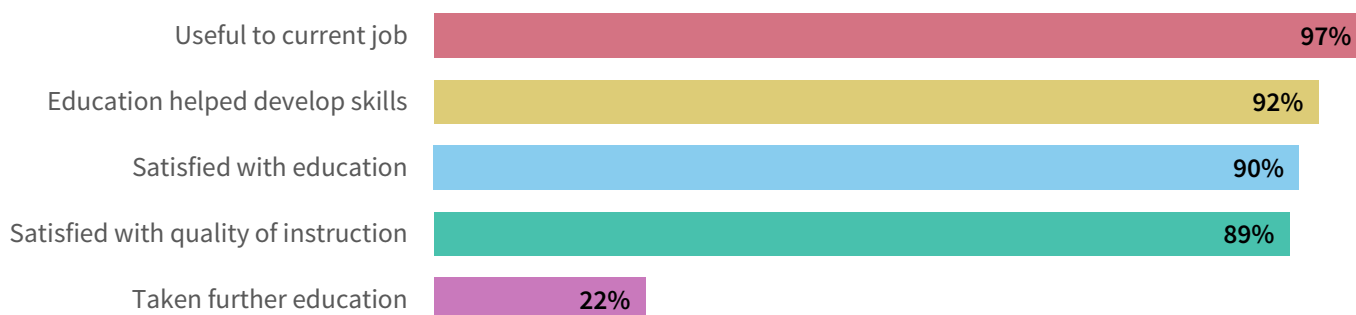
