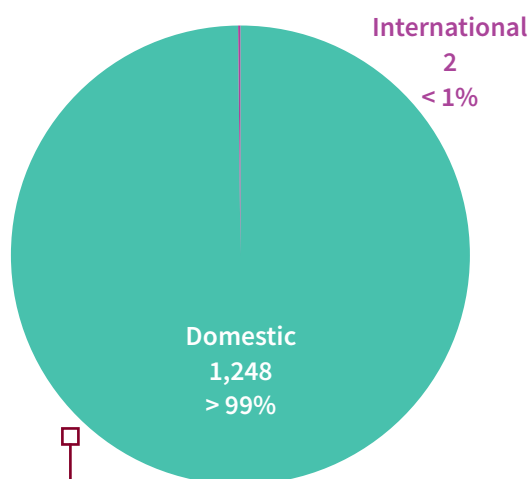

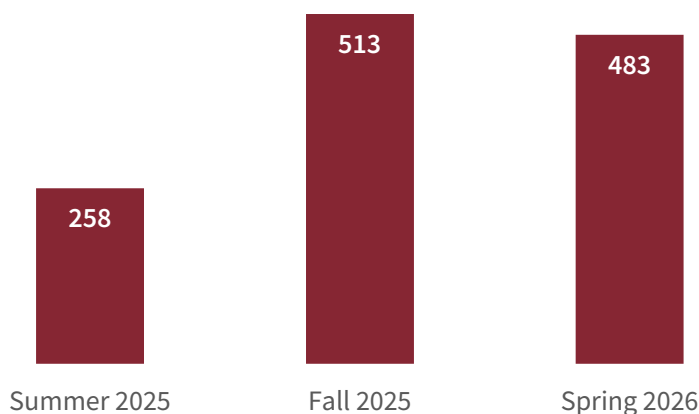

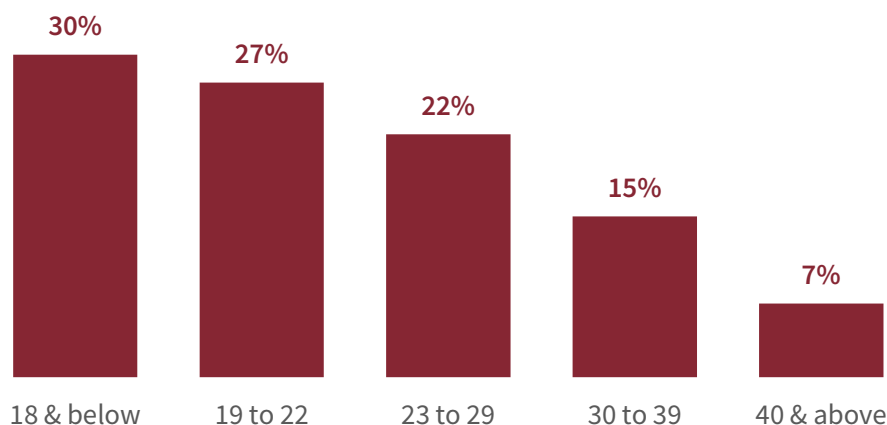

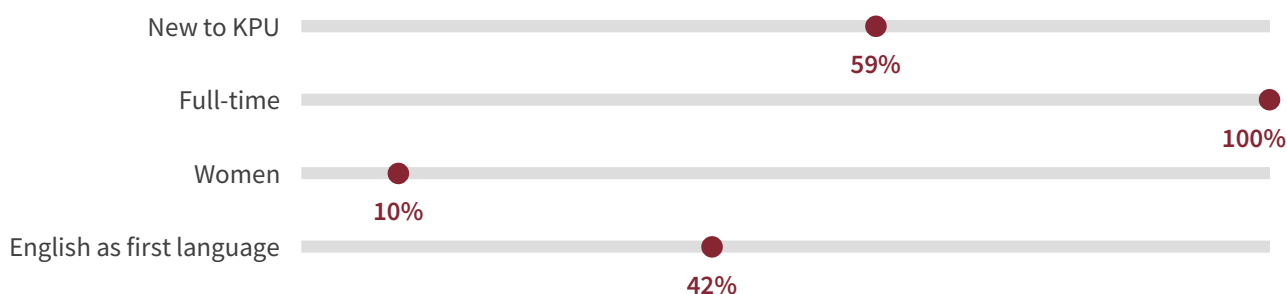
» Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)

» Key Student Demographics

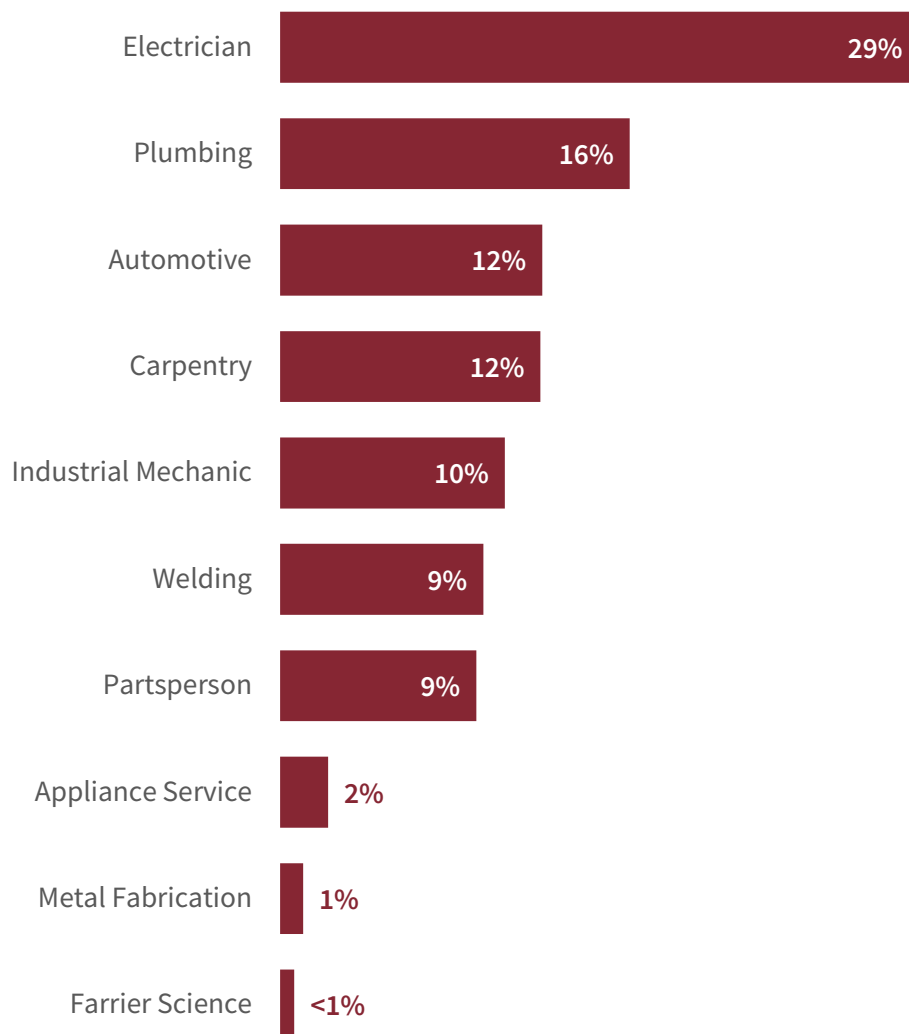

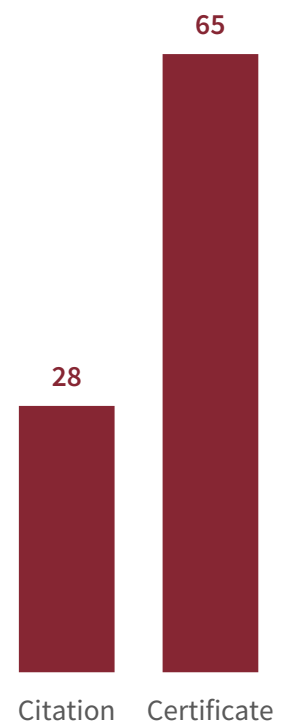
Number of seats filled at each location. Students can take classes on more than one campus.



» Distribution of Students by Program



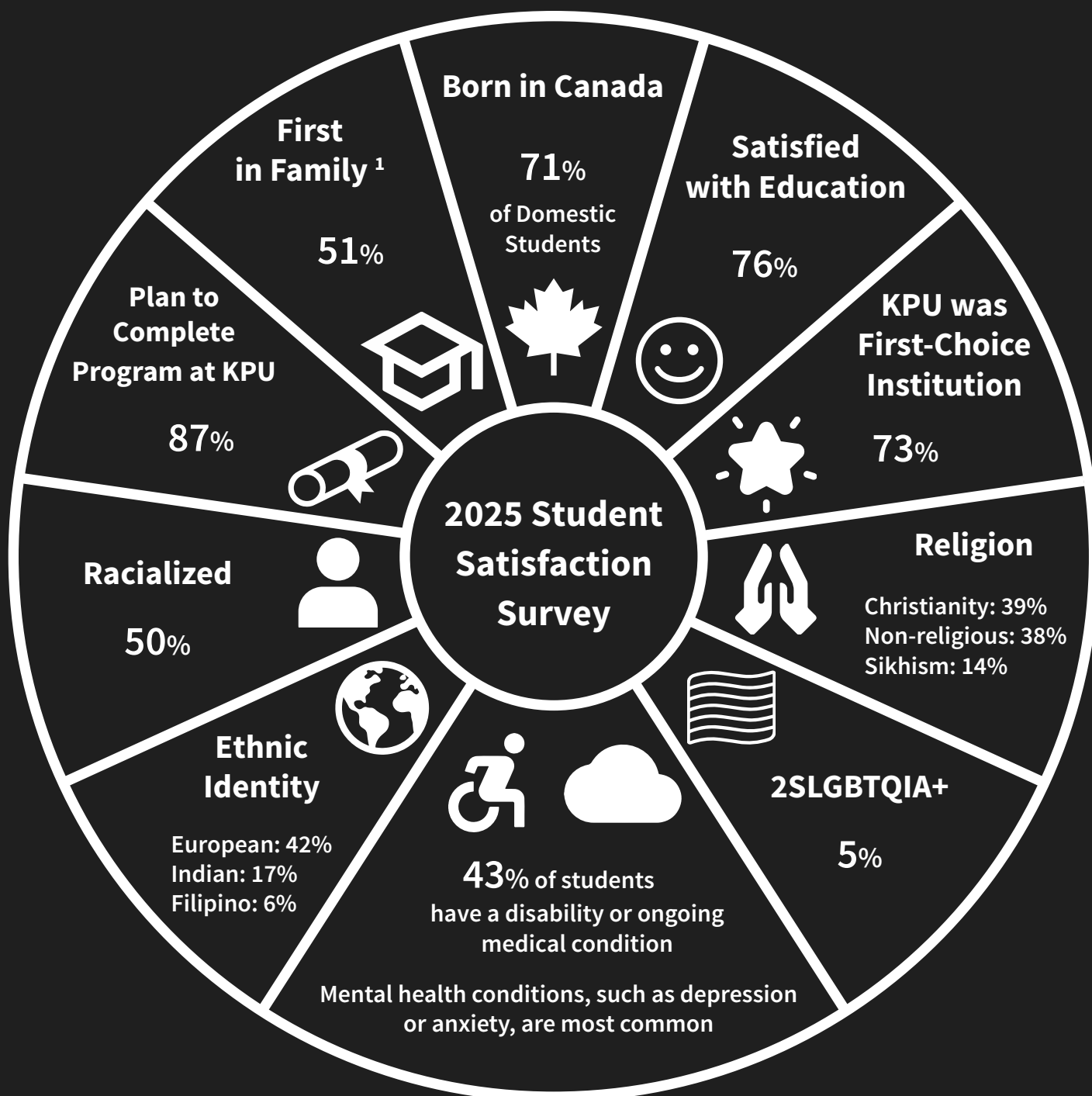
» Number of Graduates by Credential Type



What Trades & Technology Students Tell Us

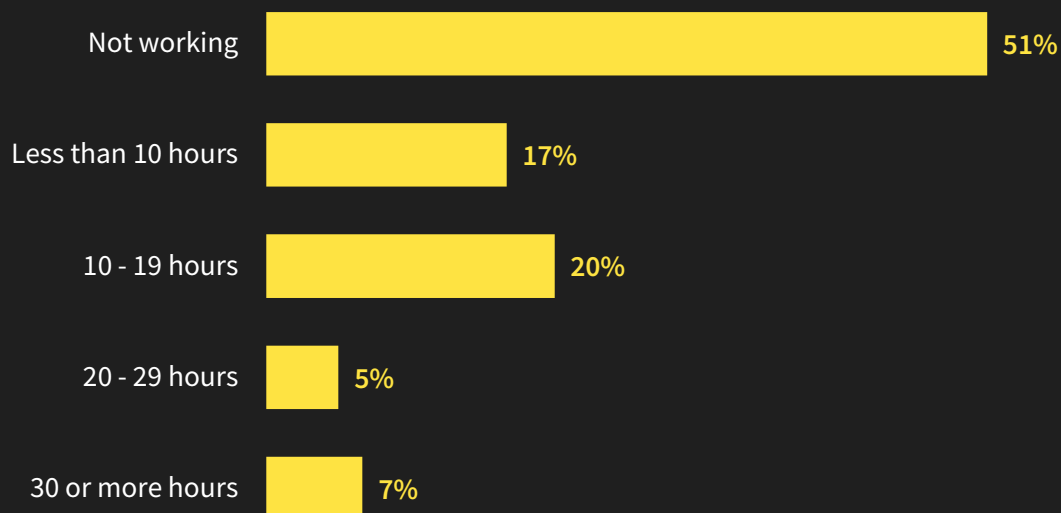
Of 562 eligible Trades students, 162 (29%) participated in the annual Student Satisfaction Survey in fall 2025.

Excluding responses from students who preferred not to answer or did not understand the questions. Unless specified, data is not broken down by domestic/international status due to low number of international student responses.

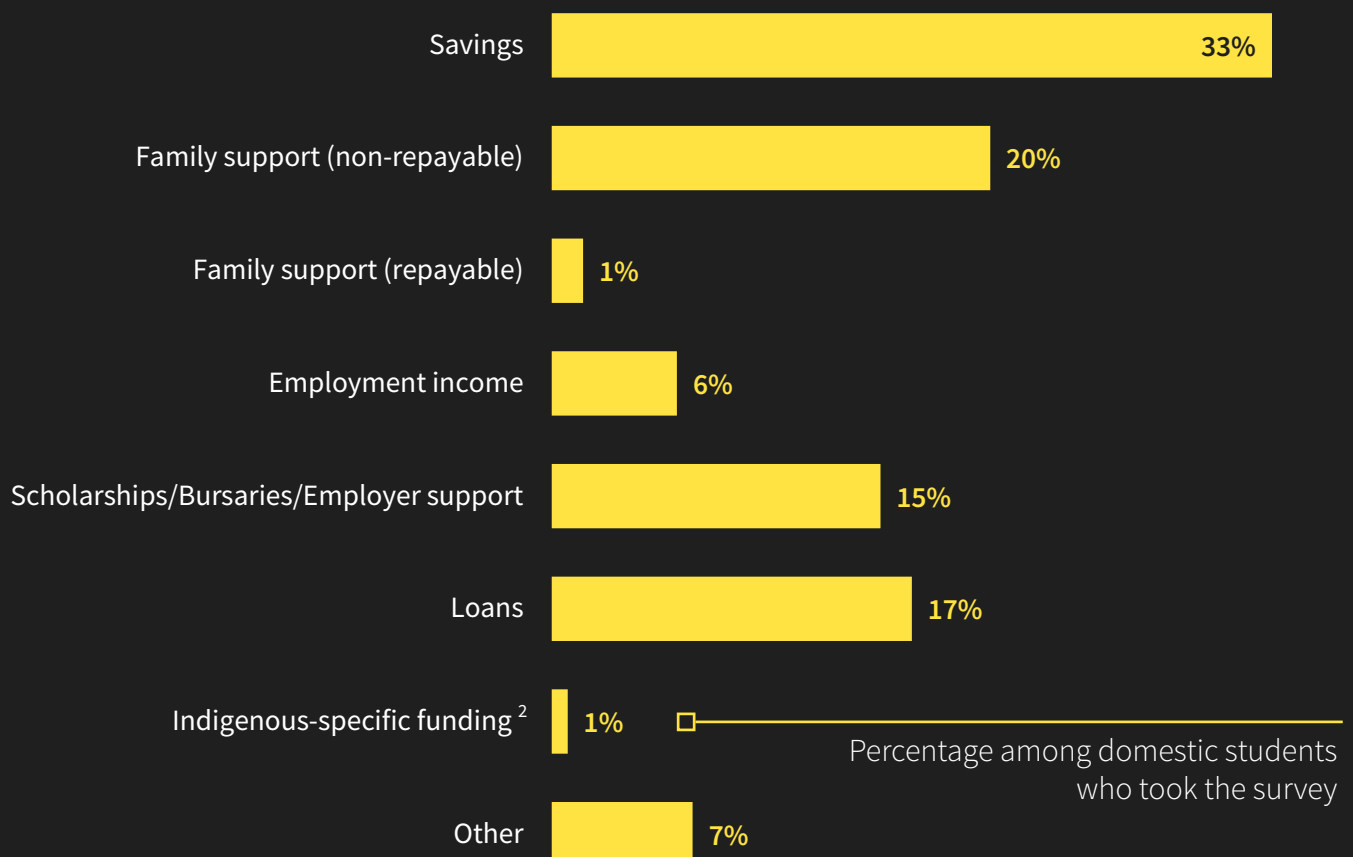


¹ **First in Family** students are those whose parents did not attend post-secondary education or formal trades training.

» Top Funding Source for Education & Living Expenses

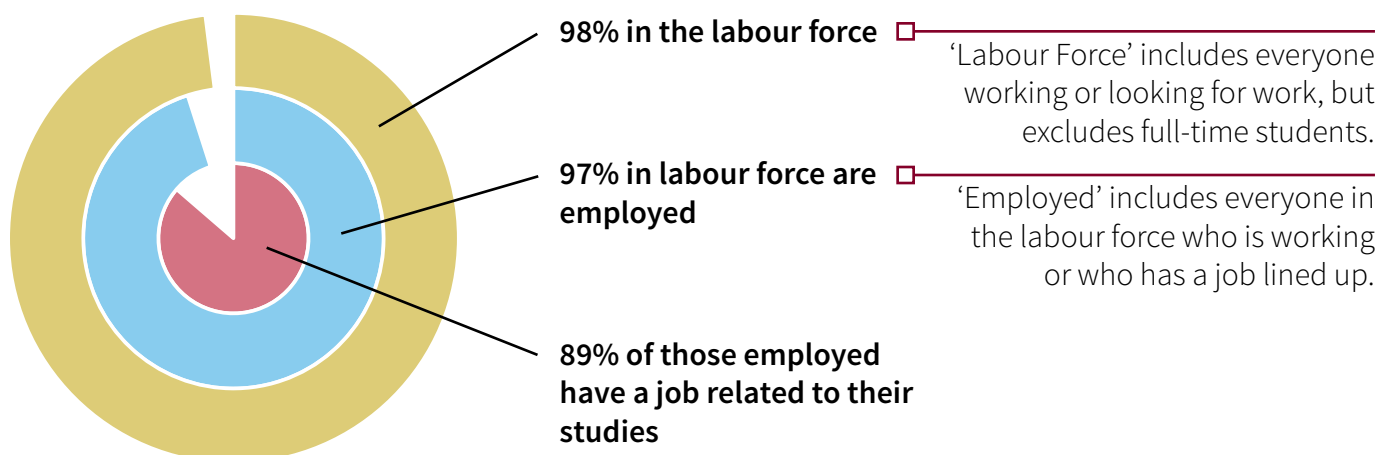
