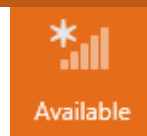


Connecting to eduroam with Windows 8

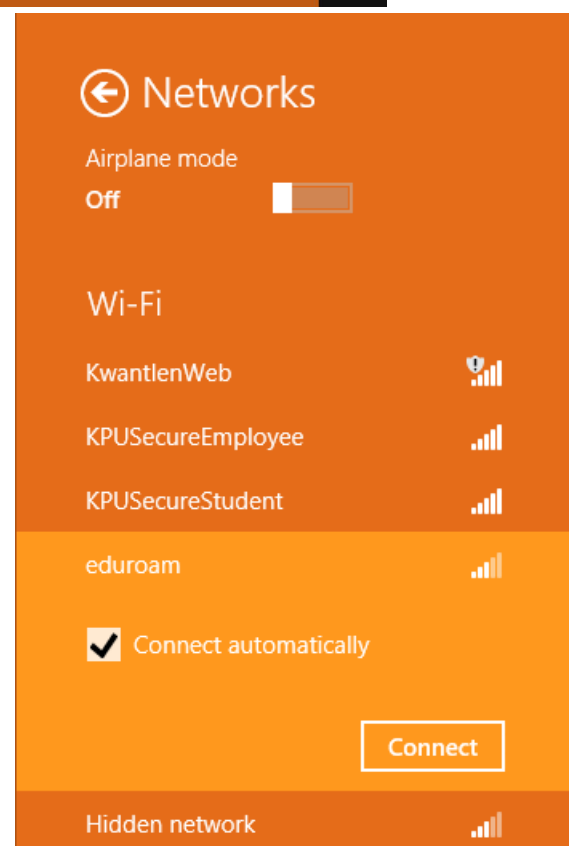
- 1) Swipe from the right side of the screen. Select the **Settings** charm.



- 2) Tap on the **Wi-Fi** icon.



- 3) From the resulting list, select **eduroam** and tap **Connect**.



- 4) Enter your login credentials.

Enter your KPU email address as username and your KPU password in the password field.

Tap **OK**.

For example:

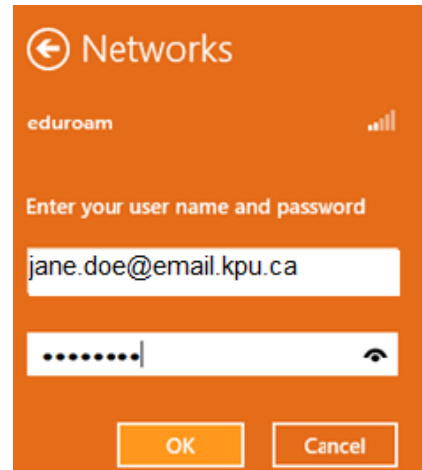
Students: Username for students would look like

jane.doe@email.kpu.ca

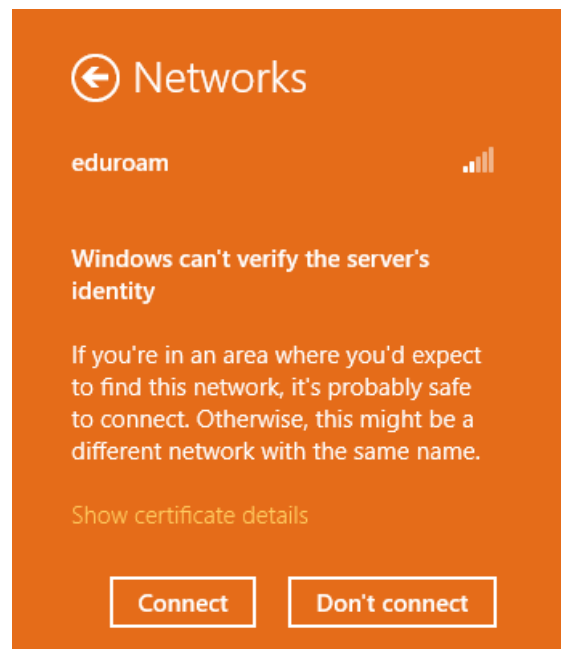
Employees: Username for employees would look

like jane.doe@kpu.ca

- 5) Windows will notify you that it cannot verify the server's identity.
If you are on KPU campus, click **Connect**.
