



# KPU Student Housing

## STUDENT ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

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## INTRODUCTION

Kwantlen Polytechnic University (KPU) is a post-secondary institution operating in Metro Vancouver in the region south of the Fraser River, which overlaps with the unceded traditional and ancestral lands of the Kwantlen, Musqueam, Katzie, Semiahmoo, Tsawwassen, Qay'Qayt, and Kwikwetlem peoples. KPU is Canada's only polytechnic university, offering traditional academic education and technical training across its five campuses—Surrey, Tech (Cloverdale), Langley, Richmond, and Civic Plaza.

KPU is working on its first Student Housing Strategy, to plan for potential future on campus student housing facilities. The university is also working on preparing a funding proposal to the Provincial Government to secure the necessary resources needed to potentially deliver KPU's first student housing building on the Surrey Campus.

The project aims to provide a safe and comfortable living environment for students, enabling them to focus on their studies and extracurricular activities. The university has been working with a team of architects and engineers to design and construct housing facilities that will cater to the needs of students. The housing project is expected to provide affordable and quality housing for students. Additionally, on-campus housing can help create a sense of community among students and promote social interaction, essential for personal growth and development.

To ensure the project's success, input from KPU students is especially important in informing these projects. The university has been engaging with students and seeking their input to understand their needs and preferences. It is expected that the project will make a positive impact on the quality of life for students on campus.

## OVERVIEW

The engagement was led by Campus and Community Planning. The purpose of the engagement was to gather feedback from students regarding the potential features of future KPU housing facilities. The findings and insights gained through this engagement process will contribute to the design and planning of housing projects to better meet the needs of KPU's student population. The input received will also help inform KPU's understanding of student expectations for on-campus housing.



This report presents a summary of the student engagement activities that were conducted for KPU's on-campus student housing project. The student engagement was conducted from 11am to 3pm at Surrey Campus in the lounge area opposite Tim Hortons between from April 17<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>. To ensure maximum interaction with university students, the drop-in session included boards along with some refreshments for students (See Appendix B). There was a QR code on the board. These QR codes were linked to Google Forms, which contained the same information that was displayed on the boards. By scanning the QR codes, students could access the Google Forms and provide their feedback online. This online feedback mechanism served as a convenient and efficient option for participants to share their thoughts, suggestions, and opinions. The engagement fostered a positive and constructive environment, allowing the students and staff to actively participate in sharing their thoughts and ideas.

Emails were sent to the students and staff regarding the engagement that would be taking place on campus. The interactive boards were designed to facilitate active participation and engagement from the participants. Sticky notes and stickers were available for students to use which provided an opportunity for students to share their thoughts and ideas.

The intent of these questions was to help determine the interests and habits of potential student residents, which can help in developing a community that caters to their needs and preferences.

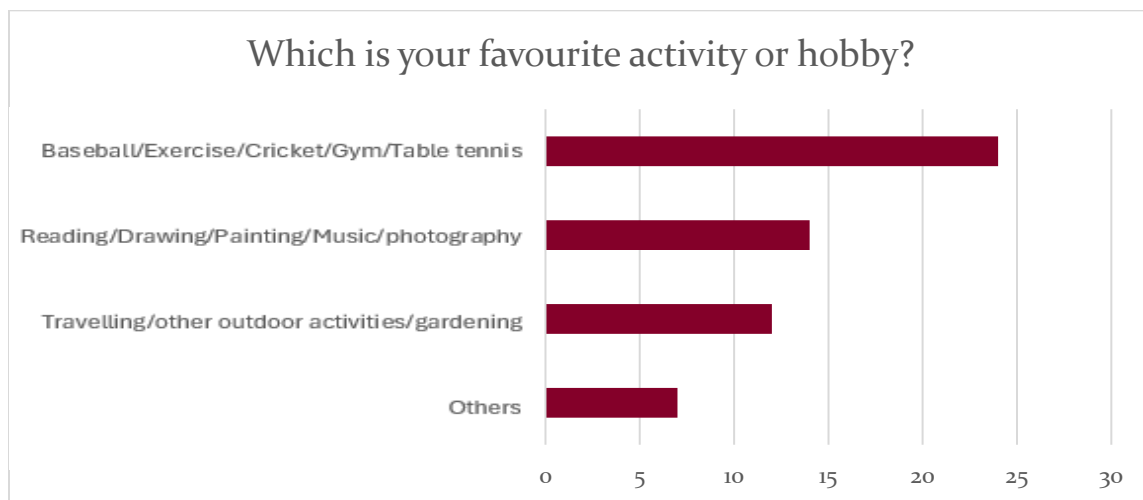

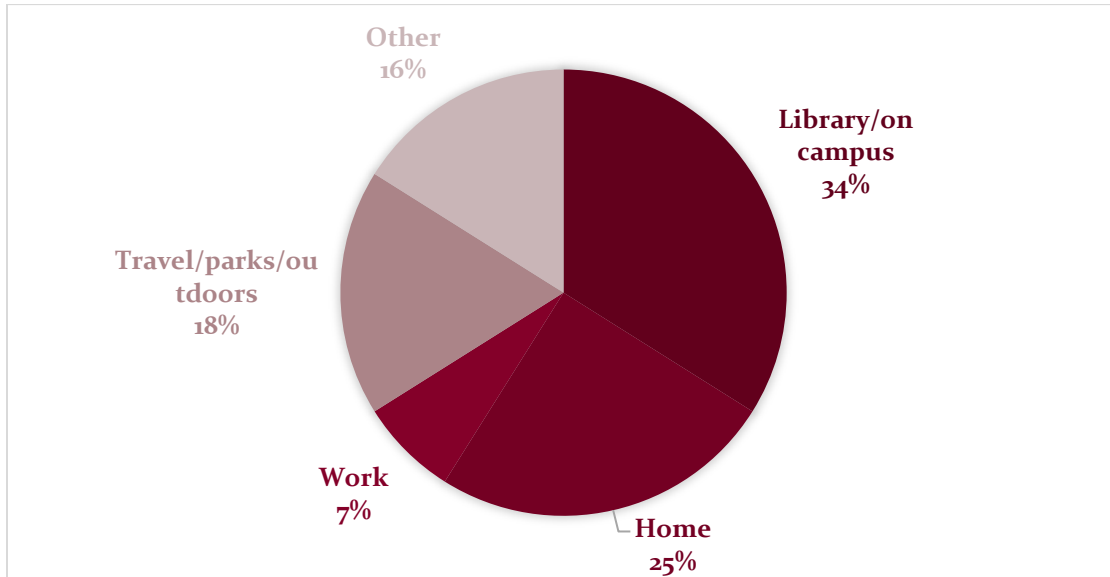
## Which is your favourite activity or hobby?

For student housing on campus, knowing a student's favourite activity or hobby can help KPU better understand the student's interests and preferences, which can help provide them with a comfortable experience. This can be especially important for first-year students or international students who may feel isolated or homesick.

The majority of the responses indicated that the students enjoyed engaging in outdoor activities. Some of the most popular activities mentioned were hiking, sports, and spending time in nature. Some students also mentioned hobbies such as reading, art, and music.



## Where Do You Spend Most of Your Time Outside of Class?

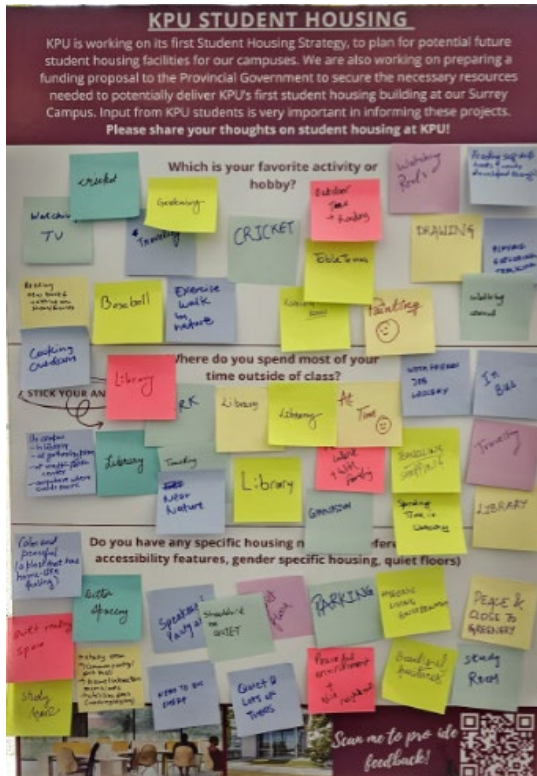


The students generally indicated they spent a significant amount of time in their home, in the library and travelling. Many students mentioned socializing with friends, studying, and exploring campus. Playing different sports was also one of the most enjoyed activities where students would spend their time outside of class.

**Do you have any specific housing needs or preferences? (e.g., accessibility features, gender specific housing, quiet floors)**



On the topic of housing needs and preferences, students expressed a desire for comfortable and accessible accommodations with all basic utilities available in the building, such as a kitchen, laundry, and gym equipment. Some students also mentioned a preference for areas conducive to studying.

Suggestions such as the need for free parking space, internet and on campus job opportunities for students living on campus were also provided.

## Do you feel like the campus offers a sense of community and belonging?

The majority of the responses indicated a positive perception of campus community and belonging. Many students appreciated the diverse range of activities, events, and opportunities to engage with the campus community. They mentioned feeling a sense of belonging through their involvement in clubs and other social activities.

### **Are you interested in a meal plan?**

The majority of students expressed interest in a meal plan, while others preferred the flexibility to cook their meals. 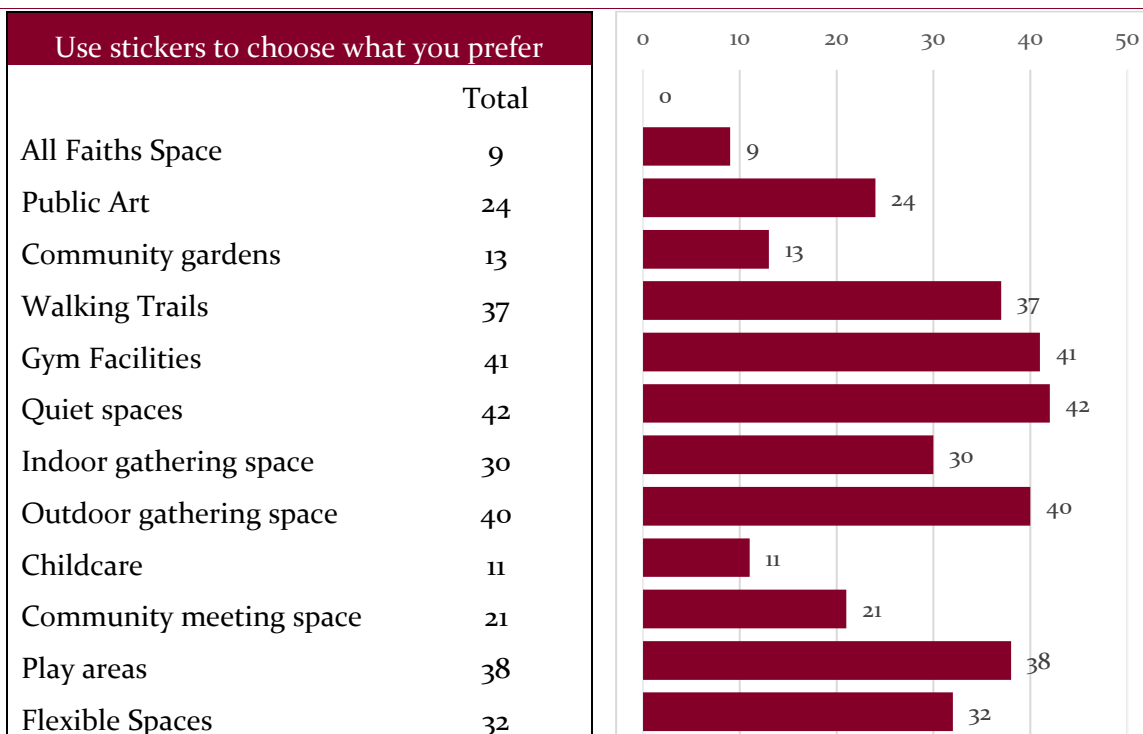
### How long would you prefer to stay in campus housing?

The students were asked how long they would prefer to stay in campus housing. Some expressed a desire to stay for the entire duration of their program, while others preferred to explore off-campus housing options after one to two years of study, with the flexibility to extend their stay if necessary.

The data collected reflects community preferences for various features based on sticker choices. Asking students about the places they would prefer to have in their housing building will help in understanding their expectations and whether certain features are particularly important for them to have in their housing.



The most favored option was quiet spaces, which received significant support, closely followed by gym facilities and outdoor gathering spaces. Other popular spaces included walking trails and play areas, indicating a strong desire for recreational opportunities. Additionally, flexible spaces and indoor gathering areas were well-received, highlighting the community's interest in versatile environments for various activities. Community-oriented options such as community meeting spaces and public art also attracted attention, though to a lesser extent. Meanwhile, community gardens, childcare and all faiths space options received the least number of votes.

Asking students which area of campus they spend most of their time in can provide valuable insights that inform the design of the first student housing project, helping to identify which areas are most important to students and what amenities they value. For example, if many students spend a lot of time in the library, it may be worth considering adding quiet study spaces to the housing project. Similarly, if students spend a lot of time in the gym or athletic facilities, it may be worth considering incorporating fitness amenities into the housing project. By taking these preferences into account, the first student housing project can be designed to meet the specific needs of students and provide a comfortable living experience. The students voted for Tim Horton's and the courtyard as the areas where they spend most of their time. This may indicate that students like places where they can socialize and spend time indoors and outdoors.



## Summary

The students' responses to these questions have provided valuable insights into their preferences, needs, and perceptions of the campus community. The importance of a wide range of amenities and facilities within or near the housing project was highlighted.

The students expressed a strong interest in outdoor activities, preferring to spend time in nature and engaging in activities such as hiking and sports, and utilizing recreational areas such as sports courts and green spaces. They appreciated the proximity of housing to public transport. They expressed a desire for comfortable and accessible housing, quiet floors, spacious and well-designed rooms, modern amenities, laundry facilities, fitness centers, and dedicated spaces for relaxation and meditation. Students also expressed a desire for a sense of community within the campus, and were interested in the inclusion of shared spaces for socializing and studying, such as lounges, study rooms, and communal kitchens. Many students were interested in a meal plan, while some preferred to have the flexibility to cook their own meals.

Lastly, the students were divided in their preference regarding the duration of their stay in campus housing, with some preferring to stay for the entire duration of their program, while others preferred to explore off-campus housing options.
