### Credits

<b>Standard course load per semester</b>	60 UK credits (30 ECTS)
<b>Standard course load for a year</b>	120 UK credits (60 ECTS)
<b>Division of academic year</b>	3 terms
<b>Assessments and teaching methods</b>	Depend on the module and school
<b>Course/Module schedule</b>	Schedule will be available on NTU Online Workspace (NOW) a few weeks before students start.



## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### Academic
