


Incoming Study Abroad Fact Sheet

Short Term Student Stamp



As a student from Canada or the USA you do not need a visa, if you are coming to study in the UK for less than 6 months. However you will need a **Short Term Student Stamp**.

You get this stamp upon <u>first arrival</u> into the UK, whether that is London, Edinburgh or anywhere else. You will receive this stamp as you go through passport control. As a person holding an American or Canadian passort you will be directed to the e-Gates as this is the typical path of a tourist. As you are coming into the UK to study <u>you</u> <u>cannot go through the e-Gates</u>, as doing so will only give you a 30-day tourist 'visa'. Instead, you need to speak to a person at Border and Passport Control, in order to get a stamp.





These stamps are still relatively new, therefore you may need to politely but firmly tell the person who is directing you through Border Control that you need to see a person as you are entering as a short term student and therefore need this stamp.

We understand that you will be tired after getting off a long flight, it could be overwhelming if you aren't used to traveling, and there may be queues, but it is very important that you get this stamp.

It is also advised that you **DO NOT travel to the UK via the Republic of Ireland** (this includes the following airports: Dublin, Cork, Shannon, Knock & Kerry.) As the stamp given in the Republic of Ireland is only for 3 months and **you cannot get another stamp once you arrive in England or Scotland**. As travel from the Republic of Ireland to England or Scotland is within the Common Travel Area (highlighted green,) the flight is the equivalent of a domestic flight, therefore you will not come through Passport Control again.
