April 2018	Everything's Gonna Be All Right: Real World Career Talk	October 1, 2018	Diverse KPU alumni share their career experiences post BA. Current students get a chance to ask real world questions and get relevant answers. Time for mingling, networking, and snacks after.	\$800
April 2018	Indigenous Right Relationship Workshop	October 2018	A 3-hour workshop on cultivating right relationship and respectful ally ship with Indigenous People. The workshop will cover: what it means to belong to a lineage; how we've each been colonized; what the long term impact of this is; how this affects being in Right Relationship with Indigenous People; what are some practical skills to use when building connection with Indigenous People; how to be a peaceful advocate for Indigenous People; how to interact with Indigenous culture in a respectful and honoring way. The workshop will be given by guest speaker Pulxaneeks, who is a powerful speaker from the Eagle Clan of the Haisla First Nation with Nuchanulth and Lummi Ancestry.	\$300

October 9 th & 16 th – 3:30pm to 6:00pm	Showcase cultural diversity of 6 different regions of the world through a traditional dance, followed by a 14 minute presentation by selected KPU student or staff. Every dance is born out of a people's culture, based on specific traits of that particular culture, rooted in a given moment in time.	\$2,000
April 2018	Poor People Organizing for Social Justice	May 18 & 19, 2018	An assembly and symposium on the struggles of poor, homeless and internally displaced people in the context of gentrification, austerity and the war on drugs in global contexts. This includes participation of racialized people in diverse contexts, including outside of Canada.	\$1,500
