Strategic Objectives

Sustainability is 1 of the 4 key pillars in KPU's Vision 2023. We recognize that sustainable procurement forms only a component thereof.

The report forms part of KPU Procurement Services' Three Year Strategy to integrate sustainability into the university's procurement practices.

Primary objectives

- Examine the extent to which KPU's procurement decisions impact sustainable outcomes in procurement
- Disseminate and highlight current actions that yield positive outcomes with regards to sustainable procurement practices
- Summarize existing best practices and also focus on developing a strategy to partner with user departments to work collaboratively on this initiative.





Methodology

Stage 1 – Primary Data Gathering

- o Distribute University-wide 1st Survey
- o Analyze current awareness levels, initiatives and practices related to sustainable procurement
- Research Best Practices and Initiatives from other educational institutions

Stage 2 – Focus Group Sessions

- o Identify top 3 user-departments for further consultation
- Run workshops with selected user-departments and discuss their challenges, current initiatives and opportunities that can be leveraged to incorporate sustainable procurement
- o Distribute 2nd Survey





Findings & Recommendations

Existing University-wide Sustainability Initiatives

- In Our Academic Offerings:
 - o 6 Certificates/Diploma Programs with sustainability as a core learning component
 - o 2 Research Clusters The Institute for Sustainable Horticulture (ISH) & Institute for Sustainable Food Systems (ISFS)
- In Our Operations:
 - o Facilities LEED Certifications, Occupancy sensors, water conservation, waste recycling
 - o Ancillaries Electric vehicle charging stations, Intercampus shuttle in collaboration with KSA
 - o IT Teleconferencing, Energy-Star equipment, nightly remote auto-shutdown of computers
- In Our Community:
 - o Tsawwassen Farm School collaboration between the Tsawwassen First Nation & Institute for Sustainable Food Systems (ISFS). To help create dialogue and land stewardship, the program brings the sustainable agriculture and traditional indigenous food systems together as a learning place.
 - b Langley Farmers Market, Science & Horticulture Veggie Market
- Kwantlen Student Association (KSA):
 - o U-Pass, water stations, Intercampus shuttle in collaboration with KPU





Findings & Recommendations

Procurement

- Address the Procurement Sustainability knowledge gap that exists through dedicated training efforts to the Procurement team and various User departments
- Currently, limited use of **Total Cost of Ownership (TCO)** is applied. TCO-based decision making will help KPU to manage its budget commitments more effectively.
- To maintain and encourage energy efficient product purchases, KPU is encouraged to become an Energy Star Participant. This is a free prestigious program managed by the Government of Canada's Natural Resources Department which provides special incentives and rebates to participating members.
- Limited inclusion of sustainability requirements during the tender drafting and evaluation processes.
 Opportunity to leverage this in the future and also include sustainability terms and conditions into drafting of contracts.

All of these recommendations are closely aligned with strategic initiatives already put in place in Procurement Services' Three Year Strategy to integrate sustainability into the university's procurement practices.





Next steps—Actions Identified



Increase Procurement Sustainability Awareness through

- Training to our Procurement Officers so that they can effectively collaborate with their user-departments to enhance sustainable procurement initiatives Completed
- Incorporating a sustainability module in our ongoing training to user departments Completed



Develop Procurement tool, checklists & reporting

- Sustainability checklist to be administered during procurement needs assessment Training Completed
- TCO guideline for procurement costing Training Completed
- Supplier sustainability questionnaire for open competitions Complete by Q3 F20
- Sustainability reporting framework and monitor progress on a quarterly basis Start Q3 F20



- Periodically identify strategic procurement competitions where sustainability can be introduced as a qualifying evaluation criteria - Ongoing
- Join KPU Sustainability Committee to help identify new competitions and further support this initiative Completed



Become an Energy Star Participant to support energy efficiency operations

- Collaborate with key stakeholders to complete an audit of existing products and their Energy Star rating and switch out non-Energy Star products - Complete by Q4 F20
- Strategically procure Energy Star products in future to increase energy efficiency Start Q1 F21
