

KPU Low Voltage Program

Introduction to Security Alarm Systems Installation

Description

This 3-week program prepares students for employment as a Security Alarm Installation Apprentice. Student will first learn low voltage electrical theory, electrical safety and codes, safe work practices, fire safety and electrical principals and then begin planning, designing and installing CCTV, Intrusion and security alarm systems in our work labs. Various practical projects are performed in a shop environment to enhance students' skills in lay out, assembly, installation, testing, troubleshooting and repairing security alarm systems, fixtures, control devices and related equipment in buildings and other structures.

The pathway to becoming a certified Security Systems Technician generally takes 2+ years to complete the in-school technical training and work-based training hours.

Student Profile

This program is suited for individuals that are tech-savvy, have strong mathematical and analytical skills, are detail-oriented and enjoy troubleshooting. Physical demands can vary; there is a considerable amount of climbing ladders, bending, reaching and hand-eye coordination activities.

- Good color recognition is important, since you will be working with electrical conductors where different colors mean different things.
- Physical mobility is important, since alarm installers must climb ladders, move around in crawlspaces and attics, do some bending and reaching and hand-eye coordination activities.
- Customer service aptitude and excellent English language skills (speaking, reading and listening) are required.
- Valid driver licence is preferred as company vehicles may be required to make service calls.
- Able to pass a security background check as per The Security Services Act of BC.

Career Opportunities

This program is entry-level training for a high demand tech industry and prepares graduates for employment by low voltage security alarm contractors and the maintenance departments of buildings and other establishments. Progression to supervisory positions or self-employment is possible; additional training and experience is offered to advance your career.

Admission Requirements

In addition to KPU's general university admission requirements, including the vocational-level English Proficiency Requirement, the program admission requirements below apply. If you are uncertain or don't meet the requirements, please contact us to arrange for testing to verify that you meet the requirements.

- Grade 12 or GED equivalent is preferred but at the minimum you must have completed; English 10, Math 10 and Science 10.
- If English is your second language, please contact our Low Voltage Program Coordinator listed on our webpage.

Additional requirements

The following information will be required to be accepted into the program:

BC Security Worker Licence*

*The Security Services Act of BC requires all security alarm installers in the province to hold a valid Security Worker Licence (Licence type: Security Alarm Installer - under supervision). Once you have provided all other prerequisites you will receive a conditional acceptance package with details on how to obtain your Licence.
